A) BRIEF

1. The present application has been filed under Section 483 BNSS seeking extension of interim bail for a further period of two weeks. The accused was arrested on 28.04.2026 in the above FIR registered in respect of a large-scale “digital arrest” cyber fraud, wherein the complainant, a senior citizen, was allegedly cheated of ₹2.02 crores.
2. The applicant was granted interim bail on medical grounds, which was subsequently extended by Ld. Vacation Judge till 03.07.2026. The present application seeks further extension of the said interim bail.

B) SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE APPLICANT

1. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that during the period of interim bail, the applicant suffered from typhoid and was admitted at City Hospital & Maternity Centre, Bahraich and thereafter at Indira Gandhi Hospital, Dwarka. It is submitted that even after discharge, his condition deteriorated and on 02.07.2026 he was again examined at Indira Gandhi Hospital where various diagnostic tests were advised and he was directed to report after three days.
2. It is further submitted that the charge-sheet has already been filed and the applicant is no longer required for custodial interrogation. It is also contended that the prosecution case is primarily based on the disclosure

statement, the applicant has clean antecedents, is a permanent resident, undertakes to abide by all conditions imposed by the Court and, therefore, extension of interim bail deserves to be granted.

C) SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE STATE

1. Learned Addl. PP for the State opposes the application and submits that the applicant played an active role in operating bank accounts used for routing the cheated amount, admitted his involvement in facilitating illegal transactions for commission and that investigation regarding the larger cyber fraud syndicate is still in progress.
2. It is further submitted that extension of interim bail may prejudice the investigation and the applicant poses a risk of influencing witnesses and tampering with evidence.

D) OBSERVATIONS

I have considered the rival submissions and perused the record. The medical documents placed on record show that the applicant has already undergone treatment and has been medically examined, while the investigation reveals his alleged active involvement in the commission of the offence.

E) ORDER

1. Accordingly, the interim bail is extended till 10.07.2026 and the applicant is directed to surrender before the concerned Jail Superintendent on 10.07.2026 (before 05:00 PM), failing which coercive steps in accordance with law be taken.
2. The present application is disposed off accordingly.
3. Copy of this order be given dasti to Ld. Counsel for applicants/accused person. Copy of this order be also sent to the concerned Jail Superintendent for compliance.
