

Both plaintiff and defendant No-1 to 4 present.

Their respective counsel Sri.CRJ for plaintiff, Sri.TLN for defendant no-1 to 4 present. Both filed compromise petition U/O. 23 Rule 3 of CPC along with copies of the Aadhar Cards and their mobile numbers.

All the parties have jointly filed compromise petition U/O 23 Rule 3 of CPC stating that on the advice of elders and well wishers, the plaintiff and defendants have settled the dispute. They have affixed their signatures on the compromise petition and accepted to compromise the matter. I have perused the compromise petition, pleadings and documents. The suit is filed for the relief of Partition and Separate Possession with respect to the schedule properties. Compromise petition shall form part of the decree. Draw final decree accordingly.
