APPLICATION FOR BAIL UNDER SECTION 482 of BNSS, 2023

ORDER :

1. The applicants have filed this application under Section 482 of the Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (in short BNSS, 2023) for grant of anticipatory bail in connection with FIR No.96 dated 27.07.2026, under Sections 115(2), 118(1), 126(2), 3(5) of BNS, PS Sector 26, Chandigarh.
2. Notice of the application was given to the State which has been contested on its behalf by the Ld. Additional Public Prosecutor and reply to the bail application has been filed.

3. Ld. Counsel for the applicants-accused submitted that applicants-accused are innocent and they have been falsely implicated in the present case, whereas they have nothing to do with the alleged offences. No case is made out against the applicants. The complainant is hand in glove with the police and they have concocted a false story just to implicate the applicants. The applicants-accused are ready and willing to join the investigation and abide by all the terms and conditions which may be imposed by this court while enlarging them on bail.

4. On the other hand, Ld. APP for the State vehemently opposed the present bail application on the ground that the allegations against the applicants are serious in nature.

5. I have heard counsel for the parties and have perused the record with their able assistance.

6. Allegations against the applicants-accused are that they along with other co-accused gave punch blows on the face of complainant Akash Lakhera, gave beatings to him as well as tried to stab knife in his abdomen, however the complainant saved himself by raising his leg and suffered stab injury on his thigh. As per the MLR, the complainant suffered as many as three injuries. Out of three injuries, injury No.2 is a stab wound approx. 3 cm in length on right thigh of the complainant. The opinion on the nature of injuries is yet to come. During investigation, the Investigating Officer has taken into possession CCTV footage of the incident. As per the prosecution, in the said CCTV footage collected from the spot, the applicants-accused have been seen beating the complainant

mercilessly while the complainant was sitting in his car. Indubitably, the allegations against the applicants-accused are grave and serious in nature. Considering the act and conduct of the applicants and the manner in which they have inflicted injuries to the complainant fearlessly in public place i.e. petrol pump and the fact that the investigation of case is at its initial stage, but without commenting upon the merits of the case, this court is not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the applicants-accused. Accordingly, the present bail application is hereby dismissed. Bail application be consigned to the record room.
