Matter called before Lok Adalath.
Petitioner and learned counsel for
the petitioner are present. Learned
counsel for the Respondent No.2 is
present.

2. Conciliation is held. Parties have agreed to settle the matter for a sum of ₹.25,25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Lakhs Twenty Five Thousand only).

3. Joint Memo is filed reporting that the matter as settled for a sum of ₹.25,25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Lakhs Twenty Five Thousand only). The contents of Joint Memo are read over and explained to the petitioner.

4. The petitioner submits that he has voluntarily decided to arrive at the compromise and that he was not subjected to any sort of threat, coercion or undue influence by any person whatsoever in this regard. The parties to the compromise are majors in age and appear to be competent to enter into compromise.

5. The terms of compromise are legally enforceable and hence this

court should not have any impediment to accept the same.

ORDER

“The joint memo filed by the parties to the petition is hereby accepted.

The petition stands disposed off as per the terms of joint memo.

The joint memo filed by the parties shall form part of this order.

The Respondent No.2 is directed to deposit the amount at the earliest without causing unreasonable delay.

In the event of default on the part of the respondent No.2 to deposit the amount, the respondent No.2 shall be liable to pay interest at the rate agreed in the joint memo.

Further, in view of the memo filed by the petitioner stating that because the petitioner has incurred huge expenses towards treatment by availing loans and is required to

undergo further treatment and surgeries, from the settled amount, a sum of ₹.20,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty Lakhs only) shall be released in favour of petitioner.

Further the remaining amount, a sum of ₹.5,25,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Twenty Five Thousand only) shall be kept in fixed deposit in the name of petitioner for a period of 3 years in any Nationalised or scheduled bank.

Draw decree accordingly."
