

Case called out.

Plaintiffs and D1 and 2 present. Smt.SS on behalf of Sri.DKB for Plaintiffs and Sri.JR for defendants present.

Sri.GR files IA No.4 U/Order 32 Rule 7(1)(A) R/w Sec.151 of CPC alongwith affidavit of Plaintiff NO.1 and certificate of pleader.

Further Sri.JR produces memo with 4 documents. D3 to 5 are minor represented by their father D1.

As per the said documents an amount of Rs.10 lakh each have been in the name of minor defendants No.3 to 5 for a maximum period of 120 months. These documents goes to show that the interest of minor D3 to 5 has been safeguarded and the compromised entered by D1 and 2 with the plaintiffs is for the welfare and benefit of minor D3 to 5.

Hence, IA No.4 is allowed.

Both the parties and counsels files compromise petition U/Order 23 Rule 3 of CPC.

The terms of compromise read over to them in the open Court and admitted by the parties. In terms of the compromise Plaintiff No.1 paid Rs.1 crore to the 1st defendant through a cheque bearing No.000034, dated 18.07.2026 drawn on HDFC Bank, Kengeri Satelite Town Branch, Bengauru and the same is received D1. The compromise entered between the parties is voluntary, without

force, coercion, undue influence and misrepresentation. The identification of the parties is verified by their Aadhar cards. Hence, this Court proceeds to pass the following

ORDER

The compromise petition filed U/Order 23 Rule 3 of CPC is hereby accepted.

Draw decree in terms of compromise petition. The compromise petition shall be part and parcel of the decree.
