The Plaintiffs and defendants No.1 and 2 are present. The defendant No.2 files application Under Order 32 Rule 7 of CPC seeking permission to compromise the suit on behalf of the minor defendant No. 3 and 4 as a natural guardian. Accordingly, defendant No.2 is permitted to compromise the suit on behalf of minor defendant No. 2 and 3.

Conciliation is held, in the result of conciliation, the parties have settled the matter amicable. The terms of the settlement is reduced into writing in the form of a compromise petition U/o. 23 Rule 3 of CC.

The plaintiffs have filed this suit for Partition and Separate Possession of suit schedule properties.

After read over and explained the contents of compromise petition in the language known to them, the parties have admitted the same and voluntarily subscribed their

respective signatures to the compromise petition.

We are of the opinion that, the proposed settlement is voluntarily and genuine. Hence, the compromise petition is accepted and the compromise entered into between the parties is recorded.

The suit of the plaintiffs is decreed in terms of the compromise petition.

Draw final decree in terms of compromise petition accordingly.
