ORDER ON APPLICATION FILED U/S 144(1) OF BNSS

The petitioner filed this application U/s 144(1) of BNSS., seeking interim maintenance of Rs.40,000/- per month. Further according to the petitioner, the marriage of the petitioner along with respondent has been held, solemnized and performed on 03-05-2021 at Veerbhadreshwara Temple, Malali Village, K.R.Nagara Taluk, Mysuru District, as per the Hindu rites, religion, custom and tradition.

2. Further during marriage, the parents of the petitioner offered 100 grams of gold ornaments. Further after the marriage, they have lead cordial marital life for 1 month happily and peacefully. As a result of the said marriage and out of marital status of the parties, petitioner No.2 was born, begotten and she is estreat who is now 4 year girl. After the lapse of 1 month of marriage the respondent started to harass the petitioner physically and mentally. As of now she is leading, eking, running and moving her life with lot of difficulties, grovelling, lamentable, pathetic, pitiful and sorrowfully. Further the respondent is working as Lecturar in Bengaluru S.G.P.T.A, PUC Collage and he is earning more than Rs.60,000/- pm. Hence, the petitioner has sought for Interim maintenance of Rs.40,000/- per month to petitioners

towards interim maintenance of the petitioners till the disposal of the petition.

3. Heard the counsel for the petitioner and also verified the documents placed before this court. Upon hearing, prima-facie the petitioner established that petitioner No.1 is the wife and the petitioner No.2 is the daughter of the respondent. If the Ex-Parte interim relief is not granted, the very purpose of the filing the petition does not survive. Hence, though the petitioner sought for interim maintenance of Rs.40,000/- per month to petitioners. At this juncture without hearing the respondent on the application, it is certainly not possible to hold any definite income of the respondent and the other allegations of the petitioner is to be proved at the trial. However, till the disposal of the petition, if this court directs the respondent to pay certain amount towards the maintenance, it would be just and appropriate hence, this court proceed to pass the following.

ORDER

The respondent is directed to pay the interim maintenance of Rs.4,000/- per month towards the interim maintenance of the petitioners.

Further, the said order of the interim maintenance passed ex-parte relief shall be

in force till the respondent files his objections.

Issues orders on the application and also notice upon the respondent, if steps taken.
