Reply to the 2nd bail application of accused Ravi Gaur has been
filed today by the IO. Copy given. Arguments heard.

In the present case, prosecution has filed challan against the
applicant/accused Ravi Gaur along with other accused persons before this court un-
der Sections 223(a), 318(4), 61, 238(b), 338, 336(3) & 340 of BNS. Now, after com-
pletion of investigation against the applicant/accused Ravi Gaur, when prosecution
filed reply to bail application, it is stated that Section 7A, 8 & 7, 13(2) of PC Act,
1988 has being added in this case along with the abovementioned sections.

Since, investigation of this case has already been completed, prosecu-
tion cannot be allowed to add more sections without seeking permission of this
court. In these circumstances, notice to concerned ACP namely Malkeet Singh be is-
sued to explain how these sections have been added after completion of investiga-
tion against the applicant/accused Ravi Gaur without seeking permission of this
court. **Copy of this order be given to given to learned APP for the State forthwith
with direction to bring it to the notice of ACP Malkeet Singh to appear before this
court on next date of hearing i.e. 18.05.2026 to furnish the explanation in this re-
gard.**

So far as bail application of applicant/accused Ravi Gaur is concerned,
the same is being decided by this court on the basis of evidences collected during
the investigation by the IO concerned and submitted with the challan.

Though accused Ravi Gaur is in custody since 13.02.2026 till 16.05.2026
i.e. for a period of approx. 3 months & 3 days and challan has already been filed
against the accused but still keeping in view the fact that the accused has been
booked for the commission of offence punishable under Sections 223A, 318(4),
61(2), 338, 336(3), 340(2) & 238B of BNS Act i.e. 188, 420, 120B, 467, 468, 471 &
201 of IPC respectively. The maximum sentence relating to the offence punishable
under Section 467 of IPC is life imprisonment, Sections 468 & 471 of IPC are pun-

ishable upto sentence of 7 years. Also, as per reply filed by the prosecution, the applicant/accused has committed a serious crime by cheating the government by selling the land.

Thus, keeping in view the seriousness of allegations and gravity of the offence and in view of totality of facts and circumstances as stated above, the accused mentioned above is not entitled to the concession of bail. **Accordingly, the bail application moved on behalf of applicant/accused Ravi Gaur stands dismissed.**

Till then, accused Ravi Gaur be kept into judicial custody and be produced before the court through VC on 22.05.2026.
