Perused the pleadings and documents produced. The plaintiff has filed this suit seeking for the relief of specific performance of registered agreement for sell dated 15.10.2018. The temporary injunction claimed by the plaintiff is not to alienate the suit property pending disposal of the suit. The original agreement is produced. Considering the pleadings and documents placed on record a prima facie case is made out at this stage. If the exparte order of temporary injunction is not granted the very purpose of the suit may get defeated by reason of delay. In such event, the very right claimed by the plaintiff getting geo-paradise cannot be ruled out. Hence, it is necessary to dispense with the mandatory prior notice contemplated by law. Hence I proceed to pass the following:

ORDER

The defendant is hereby restrained from alienating the suit property in any manner until the next

date of hearing, by way of ex parte ad-interim order of temporary injunction.

The Plaintiff is hereby directed to comply with the Order 39 Rule 3 of C.P.C.,

Issue ex parte temporary injunction order and Suit Summons to the Defendant if proper PF paid and sufficient copies furnished and if the above order is complied returnable by
