Today is fixed for hearing of injunction petition.

Plaintiff files hazira.

The summons have been returned duly served.

In spite of receiving summons none appears on behalf of the defendants.

Let the case proceeds ex parte against all the defendants.

Plaintiff files an extension petition.

Let it be extended till the next date.

Plaintiff files a petition of Section 151 of CPC for police help.

The petition of Section 151 of CPC is taken up for hearing.

Heard the learned advocate for the plaintiff.

It appears from the petition that the plaintiff has labelled allegation of violation of injunction order against the defendants.

It is not desirable that order of the Court is violated by either of the parties and the police authority have the responsibility to see that the order duly promulgated be not violated by anyone. Accordingly, this Court inclined to allow the instant petition.

Hence, it is

ORDERED

that the petition for police protection is allowed ex parte without costs.

The Inspector-in-Charge of Bhaktinagar Police Station, Dist- Jalpaiguri is directed to comply this order and also further directed to look into the matter for which the Court's order will not be violated in any manner causing any serious breach of peace there.

DA is directed to send a copy of this order along with a copy of injunction order and a copy of plaint to the Inspector-in-Charge of Bhaktinagar Police Station, Dist- Jalpaiguri for urgent compliance.

Fix **10.03.2023** for temporary injunction hearing.
