ORDER

This petition is filed under Section 482 of BNSS, for anticipatory bail in Cr.No.**75/2026** of Manvi Police Station which is registered for the offences punishable under Sections 85, 115(2), 352, 351(2) R/w Sec.3(5) of BNS .

2. The petitioners have contented that, they are innocent of the alleged offences and false case has been foisted against them; there are no reasonable grounds to believe that they are guilty of the offences alleged against them; they are permanently residing in the address mentioned in cause title, they do not have any criminal antecedents; they are ready to co-operate with the investigation and ready to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by the court. On these amongst other grounds shown in the petition they prayed for anticipatory bail.

3. The prosecution in the objection has contented that there are sufficient grounds to believe that petitioners have committed the said offences, if released on bail they may commit similar offences; they may not co-operate with investigation and tamper the prosecution witnesses. On these grounds prosecution has prayed to reject the petition.

4. Heard argument of both sides and perused the records.

5. The only point that arises for my consideration is:

Whether the petitioners are entitled for anticipatory bail ?

6. My finding is in the **affirmative** for the following;

REASONS

7. The case of the prosecution, as could be seen from the records, is that the marriage of the complainant was solemnized with Accused No.1 on

19.04.2024 near the house of Accused No. 1 at Manvi. Thereafter, all the accused allegedly started harassing the complainant both physically and mentally. On 25.02.2026 at about 10:00 a.m., Accused No. 1, along with his family members, came to the house of the complainant, picked a quarrel with her, abused her in filthy language, and also assaulted her with hands and legs.

8. Excluding the offence under Sec.85 of BNS, other offences are bailable in nature. The said offence is not punishable with death or imprisonment for life. The petitioners are having permanent residence and their presence can be secured easily for the purpose of trial. Whether the petitioners have committed the offence is to be testified during the trial. Petitioner No.2 is women and aged about: 63 years. The custodial interrogation of the petitioners is not required. If the petitioners are arrested, they would be humiliated. Therefore, the petitioners are to be released on anticipatory bail. Accordingly, I answer this point in the **affirmative** and proceed to pass the following;

ORDER

The petition filed under Sec.482 of BNSS, is hereby allowed.

The Manvi Police is hereby directed to release the petitioners on anticipatory bail in the event of their arrest in Cr.No.**75/2026**, on executing bail bonds for a sum of Rs.50,000/- each with one surety for the like-sum, subject to the following conditions;

1. They shall surrender before the concerned court within 15 days from the date of this order and execute bail & surety bonds.

2. They shall furnish ID proof of themselves and surety.
3. They shall co-operate with the investigation.
4. They shall not tamper or threaten the prosecution witnesses.
