ORDER

This petition is filed under Section **482 of BNSS** for anticipatory bail in Cr.No.**60/2026** of **Sirwar** Police Station

which is registered for the offences punishable u/Ss. 189(2), 191(2), 191(3), 74, 115(2), 118(1), 351(2), 352, 329(4) R/w Sec.190 of BNS.

2. The gist of the complaint is that on 15.04.2026, at about 10:30 p.m., a drama performance was being held in a public place, which the complainant and his family members had attended. During the event, members of the general public burst firecrackers, and sparks from the crackers allegedly fell on the clothes of the complainant's granddaughter. The complainant questioned accused No. 1 regarding the bursting of the firecrackers, which led to a quarrel. Thereafter, the complainant and his family members returned to their residence.

3. It is further alleged that later on the same night, the accused persons formed an unlawful assembly and went to the complainant's house. During the incident, the accused allegedly used criminal force against Nagamma with the intention of outraging her modesty. It is also alleged that the accused voluntarily caused simple injuries

to Sagarappa, Nagamma, Pampanna, Ambika, Ademma, and Ravi.

4. Based on the information furnished regarding the incident, the jurisdictional police registered an FIR against the petitioners. Apprehending their arrest in connection with the said crime, the petitioners have approached this Court seeking the relief of anticipatory bail.

5. The prosecution has filed objection and opposed the bail application.

6. I have heard the argument and perused the records.

7. The only point that arises for my consideration is:

Whether the petitioners are
entitled for anticipatory bail ?

8. My finding is in the **affirmative** for the following:

REASONS

9. At the out set it is to be noted that excluding the offences under Sec.74 & 118(1) of BNS, the other offences are bailable in nature. The above said two offences are not

punishable with death or life imprisonment. The offences are triable by the Magistrate.

10. The allegations in the complaint is to be testified during the trial. Looking to the nature of the offences I am of the opinion that the custodial interrogation of the petitioners is not required. If they are arrested, they would be humiliated. In order to avoid such humiliation and in order to protect their rights per-detention of arrest, anticipatory bail can be granted to the petitioners. Accordingly, the point under discussion is answered in the **affirmative** and I proceed to pass the following:

ORDER

The petition filed under Sec.482 of BNSS, is hereby allowed.

The Sirwar Police is hereby directed to release the petitioners on anticipatory bail in the event of their arrest in Cr.No.60/2026 on executing personal bond for a sum of Rs.50,000/- each with one surety for the like-sum, subject to the following conditions;

1. They shall surrender before the concerned court within 15 days from the date of this order and execute personal & surety bonds.
2. They shall furnish ID proof of themselves and surety.
3. They shall co-operate with investigation.
4. They shall not tamper or threaten the prosecution witnesses.
