

The plaintiffs, defendants and their respective counsels are present before the court and filed joint compromise petition stating that, they have compromised the subject matter of the suit as per averments made in this application.

Heard and perused the materials placed before the court. Enquired the parties and they stated that, they have compromised the suit by their own wish. The contents of joint compromise petition are read over and explained to the plaintiffs and defendants in the Kannada language known to them.

It is the suit for partition and separate possession. However, it is amicably settled as per the compromise petition.

On enquiry, both parties submitted that, contents of the joint compromise petition are true and correct and they admit the contents of compromise petition and stated that, the same is drafted as per their instructions. Both parties to the suit submit that, they have entered into the compromise under free will and consent of their own.

As the compromise petition is for the mutual benefit of the parties and it does not bind the interest of the third party, who is not the party to this suit or the compromise. Perused the compromise petition and satisfied as the contents of joint compromise petition are legal, valid and lawful. Hence the compromise petition is accepted. Accordingly, I proceed to pass the following...

:ORDER:

The joint compromise petition filed by both the parties is hereby accepted.

The suit of the plaintiffs is decreed in terms of compromise petition. It is made clear that, this order is not binding on the rights of any other person in respect of the subject matter of the suit property.

The joint compromise petition is part and parcel of the compromise decree.

Draw final decree accordingly.
