Yes Bank Ltd. vs. Mohd. Yunus**

Present: Mr. Ajeet Singh, advocate for petitioner.

Respondent remained unserved.

1. As per report of process server, respondent could not be served as the owner of the house found available at the address informed him that the respondent after selling the house 4-5 years back has shifted to some other place.
2. Petitioner filed the instant petition u/s 9 of The Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 r/w section 2 (1) (c) of The Commercial Courts Act, 2015 seeking interim relief in the nature of appointment of receiver with direction to take possession of security/vehicle make Grand I10 ASTA 1 2, Registration Number HR06AV2448 hypothecated with petitioner.
3. Along with the petition, petitioner filed an application seeking ad-interim relief in the nature of *ex parte* appointment of receiver with a direction to take possession of the subject property.
4. The application filed by petitioner along with the petition was allowed on 17.07.2026. Receiver was appointed to take possession of the vehicle.
5. Learned counsel for petitioner submits that after issuance of notice to respondent, he approached the petitioner bank and has amicably settled the matter in dispute with petitioner. He further submits that in pursuance of settlement arrived between the parties, respondent has made

the payment of entire settled amount to petitioner bank. Thus, the loan account of respondent has been closed. He prays to dispose off the petition.

6 Keeping in view the aforesaid facts into account, the instant petition filed by petitioner is disposed off.
