ORDER ON MAIN PETITION

The petitioners have filed this petition Under Section 13(3) of the Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1969 praying to direct respondent to register the date of death of the deceased by name **Veeresh S/o Satyappa, who died on 13-08-2018 at Bannigol Village, Tal: Lingasugur, Dist : Raichur.**

2. The brief facts of the petition, is as here under:-

It is stated that, the petitioner No.1 is the husband, and petitioner No.2 to 4 are the sons and daughter of the deceased namely **Veeresh S/o Satyappa, who died on 13-08-2018 at Bannigol Village, Tal: Lingasugur, Dist: Raichur.** The petitioners are uneducated and has no knowledge about making entry of the same therefore could not able to inform to the respondent. Hence the same is not entered in the concerned register maintained by the respondent. Petitioners are the only legal heir of deceased **Veeresh S/o Satyappa** and they are requiring the death certificate of the deceased for obtaining Varasa certificate, transfer the property and to get benefits of government schemes. When petitioners approached for death extract of **Veeresh S/o Satyappa who was died on 13-08-2018** the respondent issued non-availability certificate on 02.01.2026 stating that non availability of such death entry. Hence, this petition.

3. After filing of this petition, this Court has issued notice to the respondent. In pursuance of notice, respondent has remained exparte.

4. After filing of this petition, order was passed for publishing the petition in two newspapers and accordingly it was published in two widely circulated newspapers, namely 'Hyderabad Karnataka' and 'Eshanya Times' but inspite of due circulation, no objectors appeared before this Court.

5. In order to prove their case, petitioner No.1 has got examined herself as PW-1 and got marked documents at Ex.P.1 to Ex.P.5.

6. The following points arise for my consideration :

1) Whether the petitioners are entitled to the relief claimed ?

2) What order ?

7. My answers to the above points, are as hereunder :

Point No.1 : In the **Affirmative**,

Point No.2 : As per final Order,

REASONS

8. **Point No.1** : This is a petition filed by the petitioners, praying to direct respondent, to register the date of death of the husband of petitioner No.1 and sons and daughter petitioner No.2 to 4 namely **Veeresh S/o Satyappa died on 13-08-2018 at Bannigol Village, Tal: Lingasugur, Dist : Raichur** in the concerned register. In order

to prove their case, petitioner No.1 has got examined herself as PW-1 and has reiterated the petition averments in her chief examination. In addition to the oral testimony of PW-1, petitioner No.1 has relied upon documents at Ex.P.1 to Ex.P.5.

9. Ex.P.1 is the non-availability certificate, which reveals that, there is no entry regarding the date of death of **Veeresh S/o Satyappa** in the register maintained by respondent. Ex.P.2 is the Aadhaar card of PW.1, Ex.P.3 is the genealogy tree affidavit of family of petitioners. Ex.P.4 and 5 are the paper publications, which show that, inspite of paper publications, none of the objectors have put their appearance in this case. Thus, the documents at Ex.P.1 to Ex.P.5 corroborate the oral testimony of PW-1, as well as the case of the petitioners.

10. By looking into the affidavit sworn to by the PW-1, all the documents produced, and also taking into consideration the observation made in 2000(4) KCCR 2674, I find no impediment in allowing petition depending upon the affidavit sworn to by the petitioners and the documents relied by them. Accordingly, I answer **Point No.1** in the “**Affirmative**”.

11. Point No.2 : In view of all the discussion made above, I proceed to pass the following :

ORDER

The petition filed by the petitioners Under Section 13(3) of the Registration of Births and Deaths Act 1969, is hereby allowed.

The respondent is hereby directed to register the date of death of deceased by name “Veeresh S/o Satyappa, died on 13.08.2018 at Bannigol Village, Tal: Lingasugur, Dist : Raichur” in the concerned register.

Issue direction to the respondent, to issue death certificate accordingly, after collecting necessary late fee from the petitioners.
