Both the parties have filed compromise petition under Order XXIII Rule 3 of C.P.C stating the terms of settlement. The same is treated as joint memo.

The Plaintiff and the Defendants have stated in the compromise petition that they have amicably settled the disputes and they have voluntarily entered into compromise.

The Plaintiff pay Rs. 6,00,000/- each to Defendant No. 1 and 2.

We have enquired parties and they have stated that they have voluntarily entered into compromise.

Perused the property records, from the same it is clear that the name of the Defendants is reflected in the RTC. Therefore they can enter into compromise.

As the terms of compromise petition are lawful and as there is no impediment to accept the compromise petition, the Compromise petition is accepted.
