

Plaintiff, defendant No. 2 to 4 and their respective counsel are present.

Both parties submit they have settled the dispute as per the terms of compromise petition.

Both parties filed petition U/o 23 rule 3 R/w Sec. 151 of CPC along with copy of Aadhaar Cards of parties. The parties are identified by their advocates.

In the Compromise Peittion it is stated that the parties have amicably settled the disputes and they have voluntarily entered into compromise as per terms of Compromise Petition.

This court has enquired parties and they have stated that they have voluntarily entered into compromise.

As the terms of Compromise Peittion are lawful and as there is no impediment to accept the Compromise Petition, the Compromise Petition is accepted.

ORDER

The suit is decreed as per the terms of Compromise Peititon.

Compromise Peititon shall form the part and parcel of the decree.

Draw decree accordingly.

As settlement is arrived at before Plaintiff evidence. Plaintiff is entitled for refund of 100% court fee. Hence office is directed to refund 100% court fee to the Plaintiff through K-2 Payment method.
