Contested challan received from the Virtual Traffic Courts web portal <https://vcourts.gov.in>. It be checked and registered.

The cognizance of the offence is already taken by the Virtual Court and a fine was proposed for summary disposal of case as per Section 208 of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988. The violator has exercised option to contest the challan on web portal of virtual traffic courts and the challan is transferred to this court for further adjudication as per law.

It is prayed on behalf of accused that accused be given an opportunity to repent and reform as she is a first time offender and did not violate the traffic rule in question intentionally and deliberately. He further submits that accused will take care in future while obeying traffic rule, however, prays for a lenient view.

Submissions heard.

In my considered opinion, accused deserves an opportunity to repent and reform. Considering the nature of offence and genuine urge on her part to repent and reform, accused stands **admonished** for the offence **u/s 184 & Section 187 M.V Act, 1988**.

Accused is warned to be careful in future.

In view of the same, challan is hereby disposed of.
