

ORDER

The plaintiff and defendant No.4, 5 and 7 are filed joint compromise petition under Order 23 Rule 3 of CPC and stated that they have compromised the matter and received the amount from the plaintiff for Rs.15,000/-. Hence, they have not any right over the suit schedule properties.

the matter. Hence, the joint compromise petition filed by the plaintiff and defendant No.4, 5 and 7 is consider with the main matter.
