Counsel appearing for the Plaintiff No.1 to 3 and Defendant No.1,3,4 and 2 are present.

The Plaintiff No. 1 to 3 and the Defendant No. 1 to 4 have jointly filed a Compromise Petition under O.XXIII Rule 3 of CPC seeking to compromise the suit.

In the said Compromise Petition, it is stated that, as per the advice of the well-wishers, they have arrived at a compromise as per the terms and conditions set out in the petition filed under O.XXIII and Rule 3 of CPC.

Heard and Perused the Application.

On perusal of the Compromise Petition, it is apparent that the parties have voluntarily arrived at a compromise as stated in the application. The Compromise is not affected by fraud, coercion, undue influence, or misrepresentation. The terms of the compromise are not against any law for the time being in force and not against the Public Policy. Hence, the Compromise Petition is accepted. Accordingly Following

ORDER

The compromise petition filed by Plaintiff No.1 to 3 and defendant no. 1 to 4 U/o.23 rule 3 of CPC is hereby accepted and allowed.

Accordingly, the case is disposed of as compromised.

The office is directed to draw a Final Decree in terms of the compromise petition.
