ORDER

This is a petition filed by the petitioner U/Sec.10 of the Guardian and Wards Act, seeking permission for appointed him as guardian to the minor wards i.e. Anand K.L. and Manjushree K.L.

2. **Brief facts:** It is the case of the petitioner is that, he is the father of the minor wards, the mother of the minor ward by name Surekha Take was died on 04.05.2024 leaving behind him and his children as her their legal heirs. After the death of his wife Surekha Take, the minor wards i.e. his children are under the care and custody of the him and he has look after the basic needs and also provide education and medical treatment to the minor wards and he has no adverse interest against the minor wards and other than the petitioner and there is no interested person/s to act as a guardian to the minor, since the petitioner is the father



to the minor wards. Hence, prays to issue guardian certificate in his favour.

3. During trial, the petitioner examined himself as P.w.1 and got marked Ex.P.1 to 4 documents.

4. Heard the arguments of learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. The points that arise for my consideration are :

1. Whether the petitioner proves that he is entitled for guardian certificate of the minor wards ?
2. What order?

6. And my answers to the above points are as follows;

7. **Point No.1**: The petition has filed seeking the guardian certificate with respect to the minor wards, who are none other than his son and daughter for the purpose of claiming guardian certificate as the minor ward mother died without any testamentary documents.



8. In order to prove the same petitioner got himself examined as P.w.1 and got marked Ex.P.1 to P.4 documents. Ex.P.1 is the death certificate, Ex.P.2 is the G.Tree, Ex.P.3 is the notarized copy of the adhar cards of petitioners and Ex.P.4 is a letter from A.G. and I have gone through the same and I am satisfied with the contents of the affidavit filed by the petitioner. Therefore, in the absence of any contrary evidence without any hesitation this court comes to the conclusion that, the petitioner has made out his case. Accordingly, I answer the above point in the **Affirmative.**

9. **Point No.2:** So in view of the discussion made on point no.1, I proceed to pass the following

ORDER

The petition filed by the petitioner U/sec.10 of the Guardian and wards Act is hereby allowed.

The petitioner is declared as guardian to the minor wards i.e. Anand K.L. and Manjushree K.L.
