

The petitioners have filed this petition against the Respondent under Section 144 of BNSS.

Further the petitioners have also prayed to grant Ex-parte interim Order by directing the Respondent to pay the interim maintenance.

Heard and Perused the materials available on record.

In the petition, the 1<sup>st</sup> petitioner has contended that, she is housewife and she has no independent source of income and she is unable to maintain herself and her children i.e., petitioner No.2 to 4. The respondent is not paying maintenance to her and her children. The respondent is a business men doing private business and he has income of Rs.50,000/- to 60,000/- per month and he own car and two wheeler vehicle and he has sufficient source of income. Hence, prays to grant ex-parte interim maintenance.

Heard and Perused the materials available on record.

That, upon consideration of the materials placed on record, at this stage, this Court is of the opinion that, the petitioners have made out prima facie case on their behalf. It is the bounden duty of the husband to look after his wife and children. The petitioner also filed Assets and Liability affidavit as per the direction of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. In the said affidavit also she stated that, she has no income. Therefore, it is a fit case to grant Ex-parte interim order of monthly Maintenance to the petitioners pending disposal of the interim maintenance application. Hence, this Court proceed to pass the following:

**ORDER**

Respondent is hereby directed to pay interim maintenance of Rs.2,000/- (Two Thousand only) per month to the 1<sup>st</sup> petitioner and

Rs.1,000/-(One thousand only) each to petitioner No.2 to 4 from the date of petition.

Issue notice to Respondent along with this Order, if PF paid by: 19-08-2025.
