Decree holder, Judgment debtors, learned counsel for D.Hr., and learned counsel for J.Drs., have filed joint petition U/O 23 rule 3 of CPC.

The said joint petition bears the signatures of the learned respective counsels, Decree holder and Judgment debtors to the petition.

The terms of joint petition are read over and explained to parties in Kannada language known to them. Parties admit the same as true and correct.

The parties further on enquiry submit that said compromise is voluntary and lawful. On perusal of compromise petition, it is clear that the said compromise is uninfluenced by any fraud, coercion, undue influence, misrepresentation and mistake. The said compromise is voluntary and not opposed to any public policy. Parties admit the contents of compromise as legal and valid.

This Court is satisfied regarding terms of compromise. The said compromise is lawful and not opposed to any public policy.

Hence, this Court proceed to pass following :-

ORDER

Joint petition filed U/Order 23 Rule 3 of CPC is allowed.

The compromise petition is treated as part and parcel of the petition.

Office is hereby directed to keep the compromise petition along with the petition as a permanent record.

EP is closed as decree fully satisfied.
