This petition filed under Section 483(1)(b) of BNSS and this petition coming on this day for final hearing in the presence of Thiru.S.Rajendran, Advocate for the petitioner / accused and Thiru.A.Raman, Public Prosecutor for the State and upon hearing both side arguments, perusing petition and other relevant documents and having stood over for consideration till this day, this court delivered the following :

ORDER

1. Heard. Perused. This is an application filed by the petitioner to relax the condition imposed by this court. The petitioner stood charged for the offence under Section 316(2), 318(4) of BNS, 2023. The petitioner was granted bail in

CMP.No.4485/2026 with a condition that the petitioner / accused shall appear and sign before the respondent police daily at 10.00 a.m until further orders. The petitioner complied the condition from 20.05.2026 to till date. The petitioner is the sole breadwinner of his family. The petitioner undertakes that he neither abscond nor tamper with any witness. Hence the petitioner prays to relax the condition imposed by this court.

2. On the other hand, the respondent / complainant filed a counter and the Learned Additional Public Prosecutor made an endorsement that the petitioner / accused signing before the police station daily at 10.00 a.m from 20.05.2026 for the past 80 days. This court may pass appropriate order without prejudice to the prosecution case.

3. On considering the both side submission and on perusal of available materials, it is clear that the petitioner had been complying the condition from 20.05.2026 to till now and no deviation is noted. Hence this court is inclined to modify the condition that the petitioner shall appear and sign before the respondent police weekly once on Monday at 10.00 a.m until further orders.
