Plaintiff and defendant No.1 to 5 and df No.7 to 12 and their counsel present.

Negotiation held.

Both parties have agreed to compromise the matter. Accordingly, they filed their joint compromise petition along with their ID proof. As per the terms of joint compromise petition, the suit item No.1 has been purchased by defendant No.9 from the defendant No.1 and 7 other plaintiffs and defendants have admitted the alienation. Out of the suit item No.2, the land to an extent of 10 acres was sold in favour of defendant No.10 and remaining 3 acres 17 guntas

has been sold in favour of defendant No.11. These alienations are also admitted by all the parties. The suit item No.3 is allotted to the share of defendant No.1 and 4. The suit item No.4 and 8 are allotted to the share of defendant No.2. Out of suit item No.5, the land to an extent of 5 acres 16 guntas is allotted to the share of plaintiff No.3 and remaining land to an extent of 3 acres 36 guntas is allotted to the share of defendant No.12. The suit item No.6 is allotted to the share of defendant No.4. Out of suit item No.7, the land to an extent of 25 guntas has been acquired by the Irrigation Department for forming canal. Remaining land to an extent of 2 acre 13 guntas is allotted to the share of defendant No.3 and suit item No.9 is allotted to the share of defendant No.8. The terms of joint compromise petition is read over to both parties in the kannada language known to them. They voluntarily agreed upon the same. Further, defendant No.8 and 12 have acquired title through the proposed compromise. Therefore, the decree shall

be registered in order to confer their title. Further, the plaintiff No.1 and 2 have not get any share in the suit properties as the plaintiff No.3 has got property. Further, defendant No.7 is not having any share as he has already sold his portion to allot in favour of defendant No.9 to 11. The terms of compromise is lawful one. Both parties are voluntarily agreed upon the same. Hence, we proceed to pass the following:

ORDER

The joint compromise petition filed by the plaintiffs and defendants is hereby allowed.

The suit of the plaintiffs is decreed in terms of joint compromise petition.

The respective parties have already taken their possession of shares.

The joint compromise petition shall be the part of decree.

Draw final decree accordingly.

The defendant No.8 and 12 shall get registered the decree before the competent authority.

Both parties are directed to furnish the requisite stamp for drawing final

decree.
