

Plaintiff, defendant No.1, 2, 6 and 7 and their respective counsel present.

Counsel for defendants filed I.A. under Order 32 Rule 7 of CPC along with certificate stating that the matter is going to be settled and the proposed terms is in the best interest of minor defendant No.3 to 5.

Counsel for the plaintiff submitted no objection to IA.

Heard and perused the records.

As per the proposed compromise, joint share to an extent of 9 acres 36 guntas is allotted to the share of defendants jointly including the minors. Therefore, the proposed compromise is best interest of minor defendants. Hence, the IA filed by the counsel for defendants under Order 32 Rule 7 of CPC is hereby allowed.

The defendant No.2 is being natural mother of defendant No.3 to 5 is permitted to enter into compromise on behalf of herself and on behalf of minor defendant No.3 to 5.

Both parties and their counsel submitted that there is a chance of settlement. Matter may be taken up before the Daily Lok Adalat. In view of the submission, matter is taken up before Daily Lok Adalat.

The terms of the compromise petition is read over to both parties in the Kannada language known to them. They voluntarily agreed upon the same. The terms of compromise petition is lawful one. Hence, we proceed to pass the following:

ORDER

The joint compromise petition filed by both the parties is hereby allowed.

The suit of the plaintiff is decreed in terms of joint compromise petition.

The parties have already taken the possession of their respective shares, as per the terms of joint compromise petition.

The terms of joint compromise petition shall be the part of decree.

Draw decree accordingly.

Both parties are directed to furnish the requisite stamp for drawing final decree.
