ORDERS
ON REGULAR BAIL APPLICATION FILED BY THE
PETITIONER/ACCUSED U/S 483 OF B.N.S.S.

The accused/petitioner has filed this petition under Section 483 of B.N.S.S., for the grant of regular bail orders relating to Cr.No.161/2026 registered by the respondent police in the interest of justice and equity.

2. The prosecution has filed objections and thereby requested the court to reject the petition.

3. On the basis of above pleadings the following points that arise for my consideration are:

1. Whether the Petitioner/accused has made out grounds to grant regular Bail orders relating to Cr.No.161/2026 registered by Anekal P.S.?

2. What Order?

4. Heard arguments of Sri.A.V.M.-Advocate for petitioner and Learned P.P.

5. My answers to the above points are as follows:

-. REASONS :-

6. Point No.1:- The respondent police have registered Cr.No.161/2026 against the accused for the offence punishable under Section 8(c), 20(b) of NDPS Act. The alleged offences are non-bailable in nature and they are punishable on the basis of quantity of Drugs seized by the police. The petitioner is in JC since from date of arrest.

7. On 30.05.2026 at about 5.00 am., when the complainant was on patrolling duty he has received credible information that near Alliance University, close to the ladies PG at Chikkahagade cross a woman was in possession of cocaine and was attempting to sell and deliver it. He has informed the same to Dy.S.P., and obtained the permission to conduct raid on the accused. He has secured panch witnesses and police staff and then visited the spot and apprehended the accused and enquired about the possession of contraband articles. on enquiry she

has revealed her names and address. While enquiring this woman, she has also revealed that she used to procuring cocaine from Maharashtra and bringing it to Anekal to sell to college students and the public at Rs.3,000/- per gram. The complainant by conducting a Mahazar at the spot has seized 180 grams of Cocaine along with other articles from the possession of accused. Then he has registered a case against the accused for the alleged offence.

8. As per Sl.No.27 of specification shown in NDPS Act, 2 grams of Cocaine is a small quantity and 100 grams is commercial quantity. The police have seized 180 grams of Cocaine from the possession of accused which is more than commercial quantity and the same is having severe punishment. In such circumstances, the present bail application has to be decided as per Section 37 of the Act. If the petition is allowed, then the petitioner may abscond from the clutches of the court in order to avoid future

consequences. When the available materials on record discloses the involvement of the petitioner in the commission of the alleged offence, which is having severe punishment, then the petitioner is not entitled for the grant of regular bail orders. Therefore I am of the opinion that petitioner is not entitled for the grant of bail. Hence, I answered point No.1 in the '**Negative**'.

9. Point No.2: For the reasons given to point No.1, I proceed to pass the following:
