

**Ad-Interim Exparte**  
**Orders on I.A-I**

The petitioner has filed the petition U/s 125 of CRPC along with Documents, Affidavit, Assets & Liabilities Declaration and application against the respondent seeking an order of interim maintenance of Rs. 3,000/- per month on the ground she got married to the respondent 15 years back, they led happy life, that respondent had married with Nagamma petitioner No.2 was born. Since then respondent has not taken care of the petitioner as such the petitioner is residing at her parental home where she is in need of some support as maintenance. The petitioner further contends that the respondent is coolie worker. On these grounds she seeks to grant the interim maintenance.

**2.** Heard Smt. N.B.K counsel appearing for the petitioner. She contends that if it all respondent is not directed to pay interim maintenance, the very purpose of filing this application would become in-fructuous. Thus having considered the urgency in the matter, this court has taken up the application on board to pass necessary exparte orders.

**3.** The application reveals that the respondent is the husband of petitioner No.1. The petitioner has filed her copy of Adhar card, school records reveals that father name mentioned as Sharanappa, marriage photos.

**4.** Further, on perusal of the affidavit filed by the petitioner it discloses the petitioners are residing in her parent house. On perusal of the

document, the petitioner has prima facie established relationship with the respondent.

**5.** Considering the obligation casted on the respondent to maintain his wife and considering the incapability of the petitioner to maintain herself and taking note of the minimum earning capacity of the respondent, it is the bounden duty of the respondent to take care of the petitioners. Considering basic needs of petitioners and during the present situation, the price of all the basic supplements have gone to sky high. Considering the above facts, it is the considered opinion that the petitioners are entitled to minimum amount of Rs.5,000/- p.m to meet out her basic needs the petitioners are entitled for an order of interim maintenance of Rs.5,000/- pm.

**6.** Thus, in view of the above observations, this court proceed to pass the following

**ORDER**

- The respondent is directed to pay a sum of Rs.3000/- per month to the petitioner No.1 & Rs.2000/- petitioner No.2 as ad interim maintenance from the date of petition till further orders
