

Case called before Lok Adalath held on 14-03-2026.

Plaintiff and defendants are present before court. Sri. DHJ Adv filed Vakalath on behalf of defendant No.6 to 9 and filed IA.No.IV U/o 9 Rule 7 of CPC to set aside the ex-parte order passed against defendant No.6 to 9. Perused. Counsel for plaintiff submits no objection. Hence IA.No.IV is hereby allowed and ex-parte order passed against defendant No.6 to 9 is hereby set aside.

The Parties have submitted that, the matter is compromised between them.

In view of compromise entered between the parties, the parties have filed joint compromise petition under order 23 rule 3 of CPC and some copy of Aadhar cards and photos. The contents of compromise petition read over to the parties, after understanding the same, they have submitted that, they have compromised the dispute in respect of suit schedule property in terms of compromise petition are true and correct.
