: Case advanced taken on today board. Counsel for plaintiff and defendant No.1 to 4 present and parties have filed compromise petition U/0.23 Rule 3 of CPC stating that they have settled the dispute amicably in terms of compromise petition. The said compromise petition is duly signed by both parties and their respective counsels. The both parties have produced their Aadhar cards for their identity. And defendant No.4 filed affidavit has with regard to his name stating his name is Honnayya @ Honappa. The parties have now filed a compromise petition under Order XXIII Rule 3 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908, duly signed by them and their respective learned counsel. The plaintiff and Defendant No. 1 to 4 are present before the Court. They are identified by their learned counsel. On being specifically questioned by the Court, they admit that they have voluntarily entered into the compromise out of their own free will, without any force, fraud, coercion or undue influence. They further state that they have understood the contents and legal consequences of the compromise petition and pray that the suit be disposed of in terms and conditions compromise petition. This Court has carefully examined the terms and conditions of the compromise petition and is satisfied that the same is lawful, voluntary and not opposed to law or public policy. The compromise is neither void nor voidable under the provisions of the Indian Contract Act, 1872. Therefore, there is no legal impediment to accepting the compromise under Order XXIII Rule 3 of the Code of Civil Procedure. Accordingly, this Court proceeds to pass the following: ORDER The compromise petition filed by the parties under Order XXIII Rule 3 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 is hereby allowed. The suit is decreed in terms and conditions of the compromise petition. The terms and conditions contained in the compromise petition shall form part and parcel of the decree and shall be binding upon the plaintiff and Defendant No. 1 to 4. Draw decree in terms of Compromise Petition.
