**ORDER**

This petition is filed by the petitioner/accused No.17 for getting permission from the court to travel abroad for the period from 10.02.2026 to 18.02.2026.

2. The case of the petitioner is that she is the accused No.17 in CC 589/22 on the file of this court ( Perumbavoor Police Station Crime No. 23/2022) alleging commission of offences punishable under Sections 153, 143, 147, 283 r/w 149 of IPC & S. 4 & 6 of Public Ways (Restriction of Assemblies and Procession Act-2011). It is submitted that the petitioner is the State Secretary of BJP and the Managing Director of Punarjani Ayurveda Hospital & Research Centre, Perumbavoor. It is again submitted that she has to attend Ayush – 2026 Conference scheduled to be held at Dubai from 15.02.2026 to 17.02.2026 in her profession capacity as the Managing Director of Punarjani Ayurveda Hospital & Research Centre. According to the petitioner/ accused No.17 as she is involved in the above

case, a permission from the court is required to travel abroad. The petitioner/accused No.17 also filed an additional affidavit stating that her actual name is Renu Suresh and in the charge sheet her name is mentioned as Renuka Suresh.

3. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner. The Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor filed a report raising an objection since there is every chance to cause hindrance in the trial, if permission is granted as sought in this petition. Hence he prays to dismiss the petition.

4. Now it is well settled that the pendency of a criminal case shall not stand in the way or cause hindrance to decide the future of the petitioner/accused. Moreover, it is also held by the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala that pendency of a criminal proceedings is not a bar for obtaining permission even to travel abroad.

5. The petitioner/accused No.17 averred that her name is Renu Suresh and not Renuka Suresh as mentioned in the charge sheet. The petitioner has also produced copy of her Aadhar card. It is also submitted that she needs a permission to attend the scheduled programme. Hence in the interest of justice, this petition is allowed. The permission is hereby granted to the petitioner/accused No.17 to leave the India for a limited purpose to go to Dubai for attending Ayush – 2026 Conference scheduled to be held at Dubai from 10.02.2026 to 18.02.2026 as stated in the petition . It is made clear that the

petitioner/accused No.17 must be present in court on all occasions as and when her presence is essential in this case during the trial. The petitioner shall make arrangements to receive the summons or other process issued to him and shall furnish to the court the name and address of the person whom she authorizes on this behalf.
