**ORDER**

1. This is an application filed by petitioner/accused no.1 in the above crime seeking bail.

2. The prosecution case is that, all the accused, with intend to cheat the defacto complainant, Ashik and Joys Elizabeth, made them believe that they will arrange a job as Soft Skill Trainer at Australia and from 27.02.2023 till 18.10.2023, all the accused obtained Rs.5,80,000/- from the defacto complainant, Puliyanam Branch, Rs.4,00,000/- from Ashik Martin through bank transaction, google pay and cash and accused neither arranged job as promised nor returned the amount and thereby the accused committed offences punishable u/ss. 406, 420 r/w 34 IPC.

3. Notice was served to Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor. The Sub Inspector of Police, Angamaly filed report objecting the release of accused on the ground that, if he is released on bail there is high likelihood that he will intimidate the witnesses or tamper with the evidence, repeating similar offences and absconding. Hence, seeks to dismiss the bail application.

4. Heard both sides and perused the records.

5. The learned Assistant Public Prosecutor seriously objected the release of the petitioner/accused no.1 and contented that the offences alleged against him are serious in nature and his release would affect the investigation of the case. The learned defence counsel submitted that, the petitioner/accused no.1 is absolutely innocent in this case and he has been falsely implicated in this crime. He submitted that, the investigation is completed and further custody of the petitioner is not required and the petitioner/accused no.1 is ready and willing to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by this court.

6. The petitioner/accused no.1 is formally arrested 12.07.2024 and produced before the court on 11.09.2024, and he has been remanded to judicial custody on the same day. The final report was already filed and taken on file as CC 189/2025. The accused has been in judicial custody from 11.09.2024 onwards. Considering the age of the accused and considering the period of detention he has already undergone, I am inclined to grant bail to the accused. Hence this bail application can be allowed with this following directions:

7. Hence application allowed as follows:

1. Petitioner/accused no.1 shall execute a bond for Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand Only) with two solvent sureties each for the like sum.

2. Petitioner/accused no.1 shall not get involved in similar offences, while on bail.
