Today is fixed for reconciliation.

Both the parties are personally present along with their respective Id. Advocates.

Heard learned Advocates for the parties and also the parties in person.

The parties are heard in person.

They disclose their disputes and differences which arose mainly for the differences of mind set and for prevailing prolonged disputes arising out of their choice to lead life. The wife disclosed that after her marriage the petitioner used to misbehave with her along with petitioner's mother and only for the better future of their sole minor daughter, she always tried her best to live with the petitioner. From the petition it appears that the petitioner filed this petition under Section 9 of the Hindu Marriage Act for restitution of conjugal rights. Both the parties disclosed their differences in opinion and choice.

The petitioner/husband has filed this suit under Section 9 of Hindu Marriage Act for restitution of conjugal rights.

Considering the nature of the case as well as on hearing the parties, it appears that there may be fair chances of settlement in this case.

In the circumstances, I find that it is fit to refer the case to mediation in order to avert the path of contested litigation. **Therefore, the parties are directed to appear at the Mediation Centre (DLSA, Malda) on 17-02-2023 positively.**

Send the copies of the pleadings and duly filled in prescribed format along with a copy of the order to the Secretary, District Legal Service Authority, Malda for placing the matter before the Learned Mediator on the date fixed.
