Today is fixed for passing order in respect of hearing of Solenama petition dated 23.03.2023 filed by the parties to the suit.

Both sides filed Haziras. The Solenama petition dated 23.03.2023 filed by the parties is taken up for passing order as I have heard both sides on earlier occassion.

Now, in view of the Solenama petition dated 23.03.2023 the sole plaintiff Harish Mondal deposed for himself and he was examined as PW1 and he was cross-examined by other side and he was discharged. The defendant no.1 namely Atanu Mondal deposed for himself and also for rest of the defendants and Atanu Mondal is examined as DW1 and then he was discharged.

*The Solenama petition along with its **TERMS OF COMPROMISE** dated 23.03.2023 filed by the parties is taken up for hearing.*

The plaintiff stated that the dispute between them has been amicably settled out of Court on terms of compromise in the Solenama petition dated 23.03.2023 and he has put his signature of the same knowingly and voluntarily . The DW1also stated that they have signed over the petition of compromise voluntarily and they shall have no objection if the instnat suit is decreed as per the terms as laid down in the Solenama petition

Both the parties pray for passing decree in the instant suit in terms of Solenama petition.

Upon perusal of the solenama petition, I find that the parties have prayed for disposal of the suit as per terms of solenama petition as the disputes among them have been amicably settled. I find that the terms and conditions of the solenama petition are legal and valid. It also contains signatures of all the parties and signatures of their respective Advocates. The plaintiff and defendants during their examination stated that they have no objection if the suit is decreed as per terms of solenama petition. Thus, upon considering the

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solenama petition and the examination of PW-1 and DW-1, I am bound to allow the solenama petition.

Hence, it is

ORDERED

that the suit be and the same is decreed as per terms of solenama petition. Any other relief or reliefs not falling within the terms of the selenama petition stands dismissed.

Let the solenama petition be part of the decree.
