ORDER

1. These are the applications for bail u/s. 480 of the Bharatiya
Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita filed by accused no. 1 to 3 in CC 43/2026 (crime

no. 2035/2025 of Parippally Police Station) seeking release on execution of self bond. In the above stated crime, accused no. 1 and 2 have been arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 11.12.2025 and accused no. 3 has been arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 12.12.2025. The offences alleged against the accused are punishable under sections 303(2) r/w 3(5) of BNS.

2. Prosecution case in brief is as follows:- At 7.45 am on 10.12.2025 the accused committed theft of iron parts of machine worth Rs. 20,000/- kept at AS Quality Crusher, Ayiravally where CW1 was the manager. The accused have hence committed the offences punishable u/ss. 303(2) r/w 3(5) of BNS.

3. Heard learned counsels for accused no. 1 to 3 and learned Assistant Public Prosecutor and and perused the records.

4. The petitioners are shown to have criminal antecedents. However they have been undergoing judicial custody for the last 2 ½ months. The investigation has progressed and final report is already filed. Considering the nature of crime and period of custody, it appears to me that release on self bond would be appropriate. Considering the above facts the petitioners could released on bail on permission to execute self bond imposing appropriate conditions:-

- (i) *The petitioners shall execute self bail bond for Rs. 50,000/- each.*
- (ii) *The petitioners shall not threaten, intimidate or influence the witnesses and shall not tamper with the evidence.*

(iii) *The petitioners shall not commit any crime during the bail period.*

If the accused persons violates any of the bail conditions, they shall be liable to be re-arrested on forfeiture of the bail bonds.
