Order : Petition is Dismissed

ORDER

The petitioner has approached this Court seeking correction of the address shown in the final report by changing the house name recorded therein.

2. According to the petitioner, owing to a property dispute and the existence of a different name board placed in front of the house, the address came to be incorrectly noted during the course of investigation and, consequently, the wrong house name was incorporated in the final report submitted before this Court. The petitioner contends that the actual house name is different and seeks a direction from this Court to carry out correction of the same in the records.
3. Heard the petitioner and perused the petition as well as the documents produced in support of the request.
4. The final report is a statutory report submitted by the investigating officer upon completion of investigation containing the facts and particulars collected during the investigation process. The particulars shown therein are matters incorporated by the investigating agency on the basis of materials gathered by them. This

Court, while exercising jurisdiction over the proceedings after filing of the final report, cannot ordinarily undertake correction or modification of the contents of the police report at the instance of a party unless such correction is expressly warranted by law or is necessary for adjudication of the criminal proceedings. The correction now sought pertains to personal address particulars furnished during investigation and not to any clerical error committed by the Court in its own records.

5. Further, the petitioner has not stated that the alleged discrepancy in the house name has in any manner affected the merits of the proceedings pending before this Court or has resulted in any legal prejudice requiring judicial intervention at this stage. If the petitioner has any grievance regarding the particulars incorporated in the final report, the proper course available is to approach the investigating officer or the police authority concerned for necessary clarification or correction in accordance with law. This Court is of the view that such matters relating to correction of particulars contained in the police records cannot ordinarily be adjudicated by invoking the jurisdiction of this Court in the present proceedings.

In the above circumstances, this Court is not inclined to grant the relief sought for. Hence, the petition is dismissed.
