This petition coming on this day for hearing before me in the presence of Sri. M. Kishor Kumar, Advocate for the petitioner and the Court passed the following;

ORDER

This is an application filed by the petitioner/accused No.3 to issue No Objection Certificate for renewal of Passport.

2. The case of the petitioner in brief, is as follows: The petitioner is the accused No.3 in the above case. The offence alleged against the petitioner is u/s. 341, 323 and 498 (A) IPC. The petitioner is now working in Dubai as Sales Officer at Spider plus construction equipment trading LLC, Dubai, UAE. The counsel for the petitioner submits that, his passport bearing No. **X 3019031** will expire on 24.07.2026. He is the only bread winner of the family and he is working at abroad. For that purpose, it is necessary for him to renew his passport for 5 years. Hence, the petitioner herein filed a petition for No Objection Certificate to renew the passport

3. The case was originally taken on file as CC. 947/2019 on the file of Judicial First Class Magistrate Court -I, Kannur. Subsequently, the case was transferred to this court and the case was taken on file as CC. 317/2014.

4. Heard.

5. Perused the records. The offences alleged against the accused is u/s. 341, 323 and 498(A) IPC. The petition is only for granting No Objection Certificate to renewal of passport. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and in the interest of justice, I am of the opinion

that it is only just and proper to grant No Objection Certificate to renewal of passport. But a period of 5 years can't be granted.

In the result, the petition is allowed as follows:

- i) *As far as the above case is concerned, this court has no objection for renewal of passport for a period of 2 years (two years).*
- ii) *It is also made clear that the pendency of the above case will not be a bar for the Passport Officer concerned for renewal of passport to the petitioner.*
