ORDER

This order of mine shall dispose of regular bail application preferred by applicant .

2. Learned counsel for the applicant/accused has argued and contended that false and baseless case has been registered against the applicant/accused. No recovery has been effected from applicant/accused. No offence is made out against the applicant/accused. He is in custody since 24.05.2025 and is no more required for further investigation. Hence, prayer has been made for

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grant of concession of regular bail.

3. Notice of the bail application was given to the State, through learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State, who appeared and opposed the present bail application on the ground that the applicant/ accused has committed heinous crime by keeping 30 gram heroin without any permit or license . As such, applicant/ accused is not entitled for bail.

4. Perusal of record indicates that FIR has been registered basis of ruqa dispatched by SI Nahar Singh , interalia, alleging that on 24.05.2025, a police party headed by him was present at Forest Hill, Gate no.4, Naya Graon, then four persons riding on motor cycle bearing no. CH-01CE-4342 were seen coming from village Tanda Sahib. On seeing the police party, they tried to turn back. On suspicion they were apprehended. The second person sitting on the motor cycle threw the polythene on the road. On inquiry, the driver of motor cycle disclose his name as Akash and the second person disclosed his name as Sudanshu Gupta, third person sitting on motor cycle disclosed his name as Hanish and the fourth person sitting on motor cycle disclosed his name as Bakshish son of Mahinder Singh. They were apprised of their right under Section 50 NDPS Act. On search of polythene, 30 gram heroin was recovered . It was converted into parcel and sealed. Sample was dispatched to FSL.

5 Applicant is in custody since 24.05.2025. He is no longer (Hardip Singh), ASJ, SAS Nagar

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required for further investigation of this case. Recovery effected from applicant-accused falls under the category of non commercial quantity. Co-accused have already been granted bail. Presentation of challan and conclusion of trial will take considerable time. No useful purpose shall be served by further incarceration of applicant/accused.

6 In the aforesaid view of the matter and without commenting upon the merits of the case, the application is allowed and applicant is admitted to regular bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds in the sum of Rs.25,000/- with one surety of the like amount, before the learned Illaqa /Duty Magistrate.

7 Bail application file be attached with remand papers if pending otherwise file be consigned to the Record Room. .
