This petition coming on for hearing today, the court passed the following

ORDER

1. This is an application filed by 12th accused in CC 876/2023 for permission to renew his passport.

2. The offences charged against the accused is punishable U/s. 143, 145, 147, 148, 149, 283, 333 IPC and Sec 04, 6 KPWRAP Act & 3(I) of Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act. When the petitioner applied for the renewal of his passport bearing No. K3056491, the authority concerned refused to renew it on the ground of pendency of this case. Hence the petitioner prayed for leave to renew the passport from this court.

3. Heard both sides.

4. In this regard the Central Government had issued a notification under clause(a) of section 22 of The Passports Act 1967 as notification No. GSR 570 (E) dated 25/08/93 (Published in the Gazette of India, Extra. Part (II) Section 3(i) dated 25/08/93). According to the said notification, only if the criminal court before

which the case of the applicant is pending permits, the applicant is exempted from the operation of the provision of clause(f) of sub section (2) of section 6 of The Passports Act 1967. The leave shall be subject to such condition as specified by the court.

5. Taking into account the pendency of cases in this court it is not likely to terminate the proceedings of this case in a near future. Considering the fact that the learned APP has no serious objection, it will be unfair to decline the petitioner's prayer. Hence leave is granted to the 12th accused, Navashid, to renew his passport bearing No. K3056491 for three years.
