ORDER

1. This order of mine shall dispose off present above-mentioned bail application under section 439 Cr.P.C filed by applicants-accused Sultan Singh and Beant Singh, aforesaid, for the grant of regular bail in the above-mentioned FIR.

2. Notice of bail application was issued to the State and upon notice, learned Addl.P.P appeared on behalf of the State and contested the bail application. Police record also produced.

3. Learned Addl.P.P for the State argued that there are specific allegations against the applicants-accused. The offence is serious in nature. Therefore, present bail application must be dismissed.

4. On the other hand, learned counsel for the applicants-accused argued that applicants-accused have been implicated in a false case. No offence is made out against the applicants-accused. The applicants-accused are in custody since long . They are entitled for the

regular bail.

5. From the submissions of learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State, learned counsel for the applicants-accused and from the perusal of the record it is clear that the applicants-accused alongwith co-accused Palwinder Singh, Davinder Singh and Harpreet Singh, have snatched the cash bag containing Rs.38 lakhs from Baljit Singh, Assistant Manager, Canara Bank, Majitha Road, Amritsar. The allegations against the applicant-accused are serious in nature. The weapons of offence are yet to be recovered. On considering the facts and circumstances of the case, I find that in the cases of present nature, it is not appropriate for this court to stand in the way of the proper and effective investigation. Moreover, there are certain facts, relating to the offence, which are in the exclusive knowledge of the applicant and for which, custodial interrogation of applicant is required and accordingly, the instant bail petition is dismissed. Bail papers be consigned to the record room. Therefore, considering the serious nature and gravity of the offence, I find no ground is made out in favour of the applicants-accused for grant of bail and accordingly, the bail application is dismissed. However, any observation made above shall have no effect

on the merits of the case. File be consigned to record room.
