This petition is coming on this day for hearing before me in the presence of Sri.P.P.Basheer, Advocate for the petitioner and of Sri.Balakrishnan.K.T and Smt.Akshaya.K.P, Advocates for the respondent, the Court passed the following:

ORDER

This is a petition filed by the wife for declaration of Khula and so also Dissolution of Marriage.

2. The averments in the petition in brief, are as follows:- The marriage between petitioner and respondent was solemnized on 07.09.2016, as per Muslim religious rites. At the time of the marriage respondent demanded ₹1,50,000/-. Accordingly at the time of the

marriage petitioner's family had given ₹1,50,000/- as marriage gift. In addition to that 161.380 grams of gold ornaments were also given as marriage gift. 3 sovereigns of gold ornaments were given as mahar. After the marriage respondent and his family members took her gold ornaments and misappropriated them. It was by utilizing ₹1,50,000/- given to them, they conducted the marriage. After 3 months of the marriage respondent and his family members started to humiliate her contenting that she has not brought sufficient dowry and started to subject her to cruelty. Even there had been physical assault. Respondent's brother is an arrogant person as he started to abused her using filthy language. They moved to a rented quarters. While in rented quarters also respondent subjected her to cruelty. Meanwhile one day respondent's father tried to sexually molest her in the absence of respondent and his mother in the rented quarters. After that incident respondent's parents shifted to the house of the respondent's brother. Respondent used to chat with other ladies and always engaged in seeing porn videos. Respondent is skeptical about her moral character. Respondent and his family members always blamed her for not conceiving the child. She suffered all those cruelties. While so one day in the night petitioner had seen a photo in the mobile phone of the respondent, where in he was found embracing another lady. When she

asked about it, respondent assaulted her by using chair. Thereafter she informed her mother, she took her to Health Centre. Following the same she filed a complaint before the police. A crime was registered. She had already filed OP.197/2025 for dissolution of their marriage under the provisions of Dissolution of Muslim Marriage Act and MC.75/2024 before JFCM Court, Parappanangadi under the provision of Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act. Respondent had filed OP.440/2025 for Restitution of Conjugal Rights. Though they were subjected to counselling, it did not evoke any result. Accordingly she pronounced Khula in presence of witnesses on 07.10.2025 and notice was sent to the respondent. Accordingly, the petition.

3. Respondent appeared and filed counter. Statement of both parties were recorded, Exhibits A1 to A5 were marked. This Court is satisfied as to the dispute in between petitioner and respondent and mediation, admitted by respondent and subsequent pronouncement of Khula and notice sent to the respondent in that regard.

Accordingly, the petition is allowed and the marriage solemnized between petitioner and respondent is declared as dissolved by way of Khula pronounced on 07.10.2025.
