**Anshpreet Singh Vs. State.

Arguments heard on the bail application of accused Anshpreet Singh @ Tirath Singh @ Teerath Singh. Learned counsel for applicant-accused argued that the police have involved the accused-applicant in this false and fabricated case. The applicant-accused is innocent and has committed no offence at all. He further argued that no the matter has been compromised between the complainant and applicant-accused person alongwith other co-accused and the complainant has given affidavit in favour of the applicant-accused. He further argued that nothing is to be recovered from the applicant-accused and the applicant-accused is in judicial custody since 17.01.2025 and no useful purpose would be served by keeping the applicant-accused behind the bars as the conclusion of the trial will take long time. Further, the applicant/accused undertakes to appear before the court on each and every date of hearing. Lastly, it is prayed that the application for bail may kindly be allowed in the interest of justice.

2. This bail application is opposed by the learned APP for the State on the ground that the allegations against the accused is very serious and precarious in nature. He further argued that there is every chance that if accused be enlarged on bail he will tamper with the evidence and witnesses and will also try to hamper the investigation of this case. He prayed that the application may kindly be dismissed.

3. Perusal of the file reveals that in the present case applicant-accused is facing trial for offences punishable under Section 304, 3 (5) of BNS. This court is of considered opinion that there are serious allegation against the applicant-accused, which do not incline to this court to grant concession of bail to the accused. As such,

in view of the seriousness and gravity of the offence and the fact that investigation is still not completed, this court is of the considered opinion that the applicants-accused are not entitled to concession of bail. Accordingly, bail application in hand filed by accused **Anshpreet Singh, @ Tirath Singh @ Teerath Singh stands dismissed.** Ahlmad is directed to attach these papers with the file.
