This petition is coming on for hearing and the same day the court passed the following

**ORDER**

This is a petition filed u/s.497 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Sureksha Sanhita to release the Samsung mobile phone of the petitioner.

2) The petitioner is the accused in this case and he is charged with offence u/s 20(b),20(b)(ii)C of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act. It typically refers to the NDPS Act. At the time of arrest the accused the Samsung mobile phone of the petitioner was taken on custody on

19.03.2024. The mobile phone of the accused is produced before the court as PI number 69/2024. It is a private property of accused and it has no connection with the alleged commission of offence in this case. Hence this petition is filed for releasing the above said mobile phone.

3) Copy served to the Learned Public Prosecutor. Report from SHO, Kodungallur Police station called for.

4) Heard both sides.

5) From the materials on records it can be seen that at the time of arrest the accused the Samsung mobile phone of the accused was taken on custody on 19.03.2024 and it is produced before the court as PI number 69/2024. It is a private property of accused and it has no connection with the alleged commission of offence in this case. Thus by retaining the mobile phone in custody, no purpose will be served. If the mobile phone is kept as unused it may cause battery failure and potential hardware failure. Hence the prayer in the petition can be allowed.

In the results, the petition is allowed as follows:

1) The petitioner shall execute a bond of Rs.25,000/- with two solvent sureties of like sum each.

- 2) The petitioner shall produce the photograph of the mobile phone with attestation.
- 3) The petitioner shall not destroy, dismantle, sell or transfer the mobile phone till disposal of the case.
- 4) The petitioner shall produce the mobile phone in same condition as and when directed by the court.

On complying the condition no 1 and 2 the Samsung mobile phone produced before the court as PI number 69/2024 is directed to release to the accused on executing a receipt for the same.
