This is an application for regular bail filed by the petitioner/accused No.3 under section 483 of BNSS.

This petition is coming on this day for hearing and on the same day the court passed the following:

ORDER

This is an application for regular bail filed by the petitioner/accused No.3 under section 483 of BNSS.

2. The petition states that the petitioner is the accused No.3 in SC 600/2017. The offences alleged against him under sections 20(b)(ii) B and 29 of the NDPS Act. He was granted bail in this case and complied with the bail conditions. Since the petitioner failed to appear before the court, his bail bond had been forfeited and a nonailable warrant was issued. The petitioner is 58 years old and has been suffering from serious spinal ailments, for which he was

undergoing continuous medical treatment at Chennai. Due to that reason, he was physically incapable of travelling and hence could not appear before the court. He was arrested on 11.01.2026 and remanded to judicial custody. The accused was produced before this court.

3. Going by the records, it is revealed that a charge had already been laid and the case was pending here. The man became absconding and he could be arrested from Chennai. There is another NDPS case in Crime No.616/2014 of the Valanchery police station. Yet another case in Crime No.92/2018 of Athu police station, Tamilnadu.

4. The fact that the accused had been facing the charge and he became absconding is a matter for consideration. However, this is a case in the year 2017 alleging offence under the NDPS Act, this court is earmarked and designated exclusively for the trial of murder cases under section 302 IPC. Therefore on very strict conditions bail can be granted to the petitioner.

5. In the result, bail is granted to the accused person on the following conditions:-

1. The petitioner shall be enlarged on bail on his executing a bond for Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand only) with two solvent sureties each for the like sum. One of the sureties shall produce and surrender his title deed in original before the court.
2. The petitioner shall appear before the investigating officer on alternate Wednesdays for a period of 6 months.
3. The petitioner shall surrender his passport within two days of his release. If he doesn't have a passport, he shall file an affidavit to that effect.
4. If any of the conditions are violated, it will tantamount to automatic cancellation of bail.

5. The petitioner shall not get involved in any other offences of like nature while he is on bail.
