ORDER

Petition filed by the counsel for accused No.18.

1. **The averments in the petition are as follows:** The petitioner is the 18th accused in the above case. The offences alleged against the petitioner are under Sections 406 and 420 of Indian Penal Code and sections 3, 4, 5 and 6 of the Prize Chits and Money

Circulation Schemes (Banning) Act, 1978. The petitioner is a partner of a firm named M/s. Well Fit Textiles, Shop No. K-2, Khasana Center, P.O. Box 52081, Karama, Dubai, UAE and also engaged in other business activities in UAE. Petitioner requires to travel abroad frequently for his business purpose. The petitioner is possessing passport bearing No. Y7595422 which is valid till 21.08.2026. Petitioner is ready to abide by any condition imposed by this Court. Hence, this petition to obtain no objection from this court and to get permission to renew passport for a period of five years.

2. Report filed through the learned APP opposing the application on the ground that if the petition is allowed, the trial of the case would get prolonged.
3. Heard.
4. The pendency of the case need not stand in the way of renewal of the passport of the petitioner and the passport can be renewed for a period of five years.

In the result, CMP is allowed.
