This petition having been heard on 12.06.2026, on the same day, the court passed the following:-

COMMON ORDER

These applications are filed by the petitioner/second accused seeking permission to go abroad and renew his Passport.

2. Petitioner is the second accused in the above case. The offences are punishable under sections 447, 341, 323, 324, 354 and 294(b) r/w 34 of IPC and sections 3(1)(r), 3(2)(va) of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act.

3. According to the petitioner, he is now working as foreman at ROBTSTONE

(ME)LC in Abu Dhabi. Earlier he preferred an application in CrI.M P 261/2024 dated 19.06.2024 and the same was allowed for a period of 2 years. He is the holder of Indian Passport bearing No. CO438531 and it will expire on 21.07.2026. If he could not go abroad, it would cause irreparable hardship and loss. Hence, he sought permission to go abroad for a period of two years. He is intending to renew his Passport for the future purpose for the period of 5 years. Hence he sought permission.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that he is innocent and the case is a foisted one. He sought extension for exemption of his personal appearance. He has instructed his counsel to appear for him, answering his plea on court charge and questioning under section 313 Cr.P.C. He undertook he would never dispute his identity during the trial.

5. The learned Public Prosecutor opposed the applications, contending that his exemption will affect the trial of the case.

6. Heard both sides. Perused the records.

7. Considering the application submitted by the petitioner, he has only a limited prayer. It is found reasonable. It is submitted that the petitioner will not raise any question of identity during the trial. The evidence is not yet started till this date. Considering the facts and circumstances, I am of the view that these petitions can be allowed on following conditions: -

1. Petitioner is permitted to go abroad for a period of one year and is exempted from his personal appearance for that period and shall be represented through his pleader who holds Vakalath.
2. He is permitted to apply for renewal of his Passport bearing No. CO438531 for the period of five years, in accordance with the rules.
3. He shall also undertake that he will not raise any question or dispute regarding identity during trial.

4. He shall appear before the Court as and when required.
