u/s.232 BNSS.

This case has been heard today, and the court passed the following:

**ORDER**

1. Final Report in this case was filed the Inspector of Police, Vellarada police station in crime No. 672/2025, alleging offences punishable u/s.103(1), 238, 3(5), 126(2), 309(2) of BNS.
2. The prosecution case is that with the intention to commit robbery of the gold ornaments of Priyamvada, the mother of CW1, at a time between 06.45 am and 07.00 am on 12.06.2025, at the byroad near the residence of the 1<sup>st</sup> accused situated at Mavuvila in Kunnathukal village, the 1<sup>st</sup> accused wrongfully restrained and tried to snatch her gold chain. When she tried to move, the accused slapped on her left cheek, when she fell unconscious, the 1<sup>st</sup> accused dragged her and brought her to his house and committed theft of the gold chain and locket weighing 24.180 grams. Thereafter strangled her neck and had inflicted contusion to her left sternomastoid muscle and had committed

murder of her. Thereafter accused No.1 hide the dead body under the cot of his house. Then the accused No. 1 reached the house of Priyamvada, taken her bag and phone charger and locked her house. The accused No. 1 thrown the key of her house in the drainange near the public road at Mavuvila. Around 09.00 pm, the accused went to the Admas Finance of CW24 and pledged the stolen chain for Rs.1,50,000/-. On 13.06.2025 at 07.30 pm went to the Amelia Jewellery of CW34 at Panachamoodu, Pulimoodu junction, Vellarada village and sold the locket stolen from Priyamvada for Rs.7,500/-. The accused No.1 then called accused No. 2 and on 15.06.2025 morning both of them took the body of Priyamvada and abandoned it outside the house of accused No.1. The accused No. 1 and 2 concealed the dead body using sand, soil and leaves. Thereafter the accused persons put fire to the bag, phone charger and sim cards of deceased Priyamvada outside of the house of accused No.1 to destroy evidence. Thus the accused was alleged to have committed the offences U/s. 103(1), 238, 3(5), 126(2), 309(2) of BNS.

3. The accused persons were granted bail and was defended by a counsel of their own choice. Copies of all records relied on by the prosecution are served to the accused. The copies are found to be in order. S.230 of BNSS and R 19(4) of CRP are therefore duly complied with.
4. Since the offence u/s. 103(1) of BNS is exclusively triable by a Court of Sessions, the case against accused are committed to the Hon'ble Sessions Court, Thiruvananthapuram for trial as per section 232 BNSS.
5. The accused are directed to appear before the Hon'ble Sessions Court as and when required.
6. Transmit the case records and material objects to the Hon'ble Sessions Court as per rule 77(1) of the Criminal Rule of Practice, Kerala.
7. Notify the order of committal to the learned Public Prosecutor.
