Heard, perused the records and passed the following:-

ORDER

This is a petition filed by the petitioner u/s. 228 Bharathiya Nagarik
Suraksha Sanhitha for permanent exemption from appearing before the court and
for permission to go abroad for two years.

2. Petition averment in brief is that petitioner is the accused in Cr.
No. 178/2012 of Palode Police Station alleging offences u/ss. 454, 380 and 411
r/w 34 IPC. He further stated that he has got a job abroad and he intends to go
abroad for joining his job and hence he could not attend the court regularly on all
posting dates. He further stated that his family is solely depending on him for
their livelihood. He further stated that he will be properly represented by his
counsel. He seeks exemption on these grounds.

3. Petitioner present. Heard the counsel for petitioner. The affidavit filed by the petitioner shows that he has got job abroad and he is in urgent necessity to go abroad. The petitioner / accused is on bail in this case. There is no possibility of trial being ended in near future. So if the application is rejected due to the pendency of this case it will be an injustice to the petitioner. Hence the petition filed by petitioner is allowed and petitioner is exempted from personal appearance for a period of two years and permitted to go abroad for two years on following conditions.

1. Petitioner shall appear before the court as and when directed.
2. Petitioner shall file affidavit stating that he will not dispute his identity at any stage and he will not take a plea that the evidence is recorded in his absence.
3. Petitioner shall be properly represented by a counsel or person authorized by him in his behalf.
4. The period of two years shall begin from the date of leaving India.
5. He shall intimate the date of leaving and his address abroad.
