**ORDER BELOW EXH.1 IN R.C.S. NO.79/2026.**

Perused Order Below Exh.6-A, Exh.13, certificate of Ld. Advocate for the plaintiff vide Exh.19 and record. Minor plaintiff no.1 is represented by next friend i.e. his grandmother. As per Order Below Exh.13 in view of Order XXXII Rule 7 of the C.P.C., leave of the Court is granted to enter into compromise on behalf of a minor plaintiff no.1 with reference to the present suit was granted to the next friend/plaintiff no.3.

2) Thereafter, on 23/04/2026, both parties were present alongwith their respective Ld. Advocates. Parties were identified by their respective Ld. Advocates. They have submitted that, as per Compromise Memo (Exh.20), the instant matter is amicably settled between them and the suit be disposed of accordingly. The Compromise Memo (Exh.20) bear signatures and/or thumb impressions of both parties and their Ld. Advocates. I have verified the contents of Compromise Memo (Exh.20) from both parties. They have admitted it to be true and correct. Considering the facts of the case and terms of Compromise Memo (Exh.20), I am of the view that, the compromise appears to be for the benefit of minor plaintiff no.1 and the same are lawful. I am satisfied that, the parties voluntarily wants to dispose of the suit as per Compromise Memo (Exh.20). Thus, the suit is required to be disposed of as compromised. Hence, following Order.

**ORDER**

- i) The suit (R.C.S.No.79/2026) is disposed of as compromised in terms of Compromise Memo (Exh.20).

- ii) Court fees, *if any*, be refunded to the plaintiff as per rules.
- iii) Compromise decree be drawn up in accordance with the Compromise Memo (Exh.20).
- iv) Copy of decree be sent to the Sub-Registrar, Rahata vide Section 89-A of the Registration (Maharashtra Amendment) Act, 2010 for further compliance, *if any*, as per rules.
