ORDER

(12.08.2026)

1. Vide this order, I shall decide the issue of cognizance of the offences allegedly taken place in the present case.
2. The present case was registered on the basis of complaint dated 12.05.2026 of Sh.Varun Bhardwaj, Director, Department of Higher Education (NTA Division), Ministry of Education, Government of India, New Delhi as NTA had come to know that the question paper of NEET (UG) 2026 Examination was leaked before the scheduled date (03.05.2026) of exam due to this reason the exam was

subsequently, cancelled. Thereafter, the matter was investigated into and aforementioned 13 accused persons were arrested and after completion of investigation all of them have been charge-sheeted for commission of several offences individually as well as in conspiracy with each other. The allegations as set out in the charge-sheet are briefly summarized as under:-

(i) It is stated that NEET (UG) 2026 examination was held on 03.05.2026 at 5432 centers, across 565 cities in 13 languages and around 22 Lac candidates had appeared in the aforesaid examination, however, due to the leak of the substantial number of questions, the aforesaid exam was cancelled and on the aforesaid complaint, the RC in the present case was registered.

THE EXAMINATION AND ITS CONFIDENTIALITY

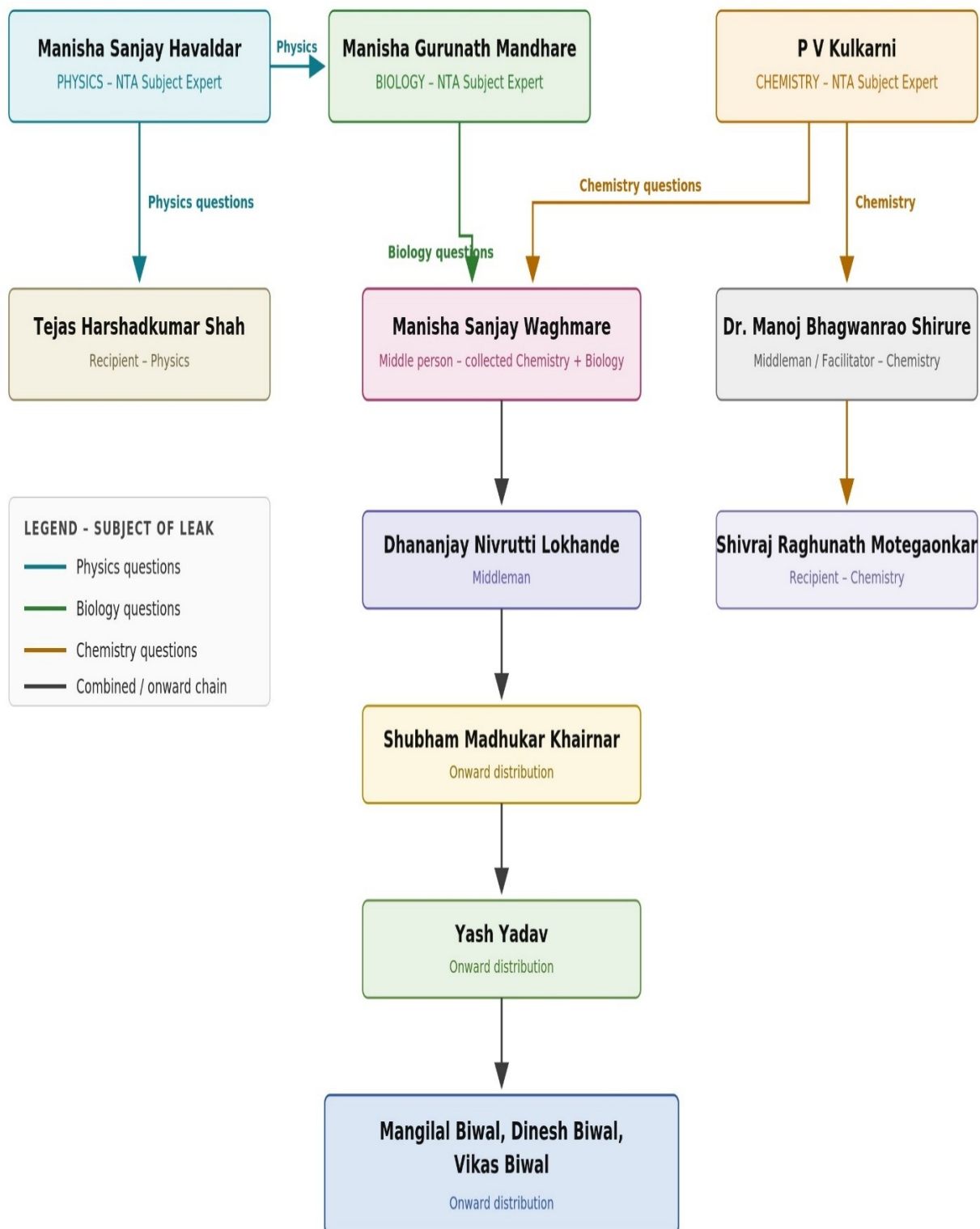
(ii) It is stated that the NEET (UG) Exam comprises 180 Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs), i.e. 45 questions each from Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology subjects. The Botany and Zoology are considered part of Biology subject. It is further stated that four master question sets are prepared for this exam, however, out of these four sets, only two sets with the code-name 'Kailash' and 'Shivalik', are printed and on the morning of the exam any one of them as per the choice of DG NTA is used for the exam.

(iii) It is stated that the preparation of the said question sets passes through the stages of item writing, moderation, vetting, translation into vernacular languages and back translation into English followed by proof reading. It is further stated that for this exam several experts are engaged at different stages but at the translation and back translation stage, only one single expert is engaged for the translation work who is able to see all four master sets. All the experts who are engaged in the confidential work related to this exam are required to sign a certificate of confidentiality and an undertaking that they will neither retain any material/information related to the exam nor they will share the same with anyone and the aforesaid undertaking was also signed by A-1, A-2 and A-3.

(iv) As per charge-sheet, initially, the information related to leak of the Exam had come to the notice of the NTA from Rajasthan and during their further investigation, they came to know that the main source of the NEET 2026 Exam leak were A-1, A-2 and A-3 who were the subject experts of Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Allegedly, they alongwith the co-accused persons worked as a syndicate for selling the exam related material of their subjects for monetary gain. Before briefly discussing the allegations against all the charge-sheeted accused persons, the flow chart showing as to how the questions related to NEET 2026 were passed on by them to each other, is reproduced as under:-

3. Now, henceforth, the allegations against each accused persons are being discussed separately.

ALLEGATIONS AGAINST THE SUBJECT EXPERTS
(A-1 MANISHA GURUNATH MANDHARE, A-2
P.V.KULKARNI AND A-3 MANISHA SANJAY
HAVALDAR)

(i) **A-1 Manisha Gurunath Mandhare** – It is alleged that A-1 was engaged by NTA as subject expert for Botany and Zoology for the purpose of item writing, vetting, translation (from English to Marathi) and back translation work (from Marathi to English) during 20.02.2026 to 05.04.2026. She had full access to the confidential exam related material (questions) during the aforesaid stages. After finishing the translation work of a particular day, whenever she used to return to her hotel, she used to mark the relevant paragraphs related to the relevant questions in the NCERT Text Books and thereafter, because of her expertise in the subject, she used to formulate the relevant questions which she subsequently shared with several candidates during coaching classes conducted by her at her residence. Thus, as per charge-sheet, she had memorized the relevant questions during translation work and because of her expertise on the subject, she had prepared the data bank of all those relevant questions which she had gone through during the translation work. During coaching, she instructed the candidates to mark specific paragraphs in the fresh NCERT Class-XI and

Class XII test books and also dictated the questions which were to be written by the candidates in the margin of the book and she used to correct the fair copies made by them of those questions. Thus, in this manner, she shared the confidential questions related to her subject with several students who have also made their statements in this regard u/s 180 of BNSS and statements of some of the candidates and their parents have also been recorded u/s 183(5) BNSS (D-384 and D-385). Some of the handwritten biology books have been recovered from the aforesaid candidates. Besides, there are further allegations against A-1 that she was also in touch with A-3 through whom she had received the physics subject questions. Allegedly, A-1 had shared the physics questions with a candidates by dictating the Physics questions to her. A-1 had received certain images of handwritten physics questions from the mobile phone of the husband of A-3. Who had received the same from A-4. She had also taken print out of the aforesaid physics questions by visiting the office of A-3 from the pen drive brought by her in this regard, the relevant CCTV footage has also been seized. Thus, as per prosecution case, A-1 not only shared the confidential questions of her subject with several candidates during coaching but she was also involved in the leak of physics questions in active connivance with A-3 who is the subject expert of Physics. The laptop and mobile phone of A-1 containing the aforesaid material have been seized (LA-6 and LA-4) and the relevant material stated to

have been recovered from the aforesaid devices. It is stated that out of the total 90 questions of Biology subject disseminated by her, 79 questions appeared in NEET (UG) 2026 Exam. 79 questions are those questions which actually appeared in the Exam but as per prosecution she had circulated several other questions which were part of other original question paper sets prepared by NTA but same were not used for NEET (UG) 2026 Exam. The statements of several witnesses regarding the active involvement of A-1 in disseminating the leaked questions of Biology through that particular modus operandi have also been recorded which have been made part of the present charge-sheet. Besides, the relevant CDRs of mobile phones of A-1, A-2, A-3 and A-7 have also been collected to establish that they were in regular touch with each other at the relevant time and were operating as a syndicate.

(ii) Likewise, **A-2 P.V.Kulkarni** was also a subject expert and he was associated with NTA for Chemistry subject and he was also engaged for the translation work related to NEET (UG) 2026 Exam for his subject. A-2 was assigned with the translation work (English to Marathi) of original question paper sets from 22.02.2026 to 26.02.2026 and also for back transaction (Marathi to English) from 31.03.2026 to 02.04.2026 and also for proof reading of the back translation on 05.04.2026. Like A-1, he had also signed the certificate of confidentiality that he will not share the exam related material with anyone in any manner. Allegedly, during the

said translation/back translation work, he used to prepare short notes of the exam related material on small chits and in this manner, he copied all 135 questions of Chemistry subject along with their answer options and took them out of NTA office discreetly and in a concealed manner. Some of the simple questions were noted down by him subsequently in his hotel by memorizing the same. During investigation, it has come to light that by conducting special classes for several candidates at his Pune residence, he shared the Chemistry questions relating to NEET (UG) 2026 Exam prior to the examination for monetary gain. The statements of some of the candidates have been recorded by the CBI and statements of some of the candidates have also been recorded under Section 183(5) of BNSS 2023 (Sec.164 CrPC). Allegedly, the digital evidence recovered from his mobile handset shows that he had shared the Chemistry subject questions (related to NEET (UG) 2026 Exam) with the candidates, their parents and co-accused persons, prior to the scheduled date of the exam. Allegedly, he had visited the hospital of A-6 and there, he had provided the aforesaid exam related material to the son of A-5. A-6 had also referred some parents of the candidates to A-2 for this purpose and the parents of those candidates had directly paid Rs.3 Lacs each to A-2 at his residence at the instance of A-6. Allegedly, A-2 had also attempted to obtain Physics subject material from another Physics subject expert namely Bhalchandra Waman Bhome. He also induced the aforesaid

person by offering money but the said person refused the said offer and instead of the relevant material, he provided the relative of A-2 with the previous years' question book of Marvel Publications. Thus, allegedly, A-2 in conspiracy with co-accused persons had shared the questions of his subject related to NEET (UG) 2026 Exam with several candidates and co-accused persons for monetary gain. It is stated that out of the total leaked questions, all 45 questions of chemistry subject which actually appeared in the exam got matched with the leaked questions. Thus, as per the evidence collected by the investigating agency, all the 45 questions of chemistry subject which actually appeared in NEET (UG) 2026 Exam were leaked/circulated by A-2 prior to the scheduled date of exam. Allegedly, 45 questions are those questions which actually appeared in the exam but as per the evidence collected by the CBI during investigation shows that he had shared several other questions which were part of original question paper sets prepared by NTA but said paper sets were not used for NEET (UG) 2026 Exam. The statements of several witnesses regarding the active involvement of A-2 in dissemination of the leaked questions of Chemistry subject through that particular modus operandi (dissemination of leaked questions through distribution of hand written notes) have also been recorded which have also been made part of the present charge-sheet. Besides, the CDRs of mobile phone of A-2 alongwith A-1, A-6 and A-7 have been placed

on record to show that they were in constant touch with each other at the relevant time.

(iii) Like A-1 and A-2, **A-3 Manisha Sanjay Havaladar** is also a subject expert and allegedly, she was assigned with the translation work of Physics subject. She was entrusted with the Set 1, Set 2 & Set 4 of Physics subject during the said translation work. She carried out the said work from 14.03.2026 to 05.04.2026. She also used to note down the questions related to this exam after she used to return to her hotel at Delhi where she was staying during the aforesaid translation work. She had dictated some questions to A-4 at her residence who noted about 68 questions and on 25.04.2026, he transmitted the handwritten notes of those questions to the phone of Mr. Sanjay Havaladar (husband of A-3) which were further forwarded to A-1 on 26.04.2026. Allegedly, at the instance of A-1, A-3 had also supplied the printouts of leaked physics questions to mother of one of the candidates against payment of Rs.25,000/- and all these printouts stated to have been recovered from the residence of the aforesaid person. Allegedly, after the news of exam leak surfaced in the media, A-3 had burnt the notebook in which she had noted the aforesaid questions. Thus, as per prosecution case, A-3 had leaked the Physics subject questions in conspiracy with A-1. It is stated that out of the questions leaked/circulated by A-3, 20 questions appeared in the exam. Besides, the aforesaid questions, she had also circulated the other questions though the same did not

appear in the exam but same were part of the master sets prepared by NTA for NEET (UG) 2026 Exam. The statements of several witnesses regarding the active involvement of A-3 in dissemination of the leaked questions of Physics subject through that particular modus operandi have also been recorded which have been made part of the present charge-sheet. Similarly, the CDRs of mobile phone of A-3 have also been obtained and made part of the present charge-sheet to show her connection with the co-accused persons qua the said illegal activities.

ALLEGATIONS AGAINST CO-ACCUSED PERSONS
(A-4 TO A-13)

(iv) **A-4 Tejas Harshadkumar Shah** is a private person and allegedly, he is another part of the exam leak syndicate. He assisted A-3 in leaking and dissemination and circulation of the Physics exam questions after same were shared by A-3 with him through dictation. As per allegations, A-4 who is a Physics Teacher was involved in this process by A-3. He provided his assistance in scribbling the relevant questions of Physics subject and after noting down the same, he shared 16 images containing 68 questions of Physics subject with the husband of A-3 which were then transmitted to A-1 through the mobile handset of Mr. Sanjay Havaladar (husband of A-3). During this period, A-3 & A-4 had also communicated with each other over telephone. A-4 had destroyed the relevant material and also formatted his

mobile handset after the leak news surfaced, however, the questions shared by him with Mr. Sanjay Havaladar stated to have been recovered from his mobile handset. Thus, as per prosecution case, Physics subject questions were firstly shared by A-4 with the aforesaid person and only thereafter, the further leak of these questions took place. The relevant CDRs of his mobile phone number have already been obtained and made part of the present charge-sheet.

(v) As per prosecution case, **A-5 Shivraj Raghunath Motegaonkar** is one of important links of this entire exam syndicate. It is stated that A-5 is Managing Partner of RCC Coaching Centre, Latur and he, with the assistance of A-6 who was running a hospital namely Siddhi Vinayak Hospital at Latur at that time, had obtained the Chemistry subject questions from A-2 through his son. Allegedly, A-6 facilitated a meeting of A-2 and son of A-5 at his hospital where A-2 had provided the Chemistry subject questions to his son against which A-6 had received Rs.5 Lacs from A-5 which were allegedly recovered from the house of the sister of A-6. Thus, as per charge-sheet, the first allegation against A-5 is that he had procured the Chemistry questions from A-2 after paying the aforesaid hefty amount against the same and secondly, he had shared 132 handwritten Chemistry questions in his own handwriting with two students and these handwritten notes were recovered from one of the students whose mother had taken out the printout of the same. The images of the aforesaid questions stated to

have also been recovered from the mobile handset of A-5 through forensic examination though after the leak news surfaced, from his side, he had deleted the same. Besides, after the aforesaid exam was conducted, A-5 had released a video on social media claiming that he had predicted the entire Chemistry paper as all the questions shared by him appeared in the aforesaid exam. The statements of several witnesses regarding his active involvement in dissemination of the leaked questions through that particular modus operandi have also been recorded which have also been made part of the present charge-sheet. Besides, the CDRs of his mobile phone have also been obtained and made part of the present charge-sheet to show his connection with the co-accused persons.

(vi) **A-6 Dr. Manoj Bhagwanrao Shirure** is a doctor by profession and at the relevant time, he was running a hospital namely Siddhivinayak Hospital at Latur and allegedly, he facilitated A-2 in dissemination of leaked Chemistry questions of the aforesaid exam. He provided two students to A-2 and the parents of both these candidates have paid Rs.3 Lacs each to A-2 for the said classes. During coaching, A-2 had provided them the leaked Chemistry questions. Regarding above, the statements of both these candidates as well as their parents have been recorded under Section 180 BNSS (161 CrPC) as well as under Section 183(5) of BNSS (164 CrPC). As already discussed, besides facilitating the aforesaid candidates to A-2, allegedly, A-6

had also facilitated A-5 in getting his son the Chemistry questions at his hospital against which he had taken Rs.5 Lacs from A-5 which have been recovered and seized. The statements of several witnesses regarding the active involvement of A-6 in dissemination of the leaked questions through that particular modus operandi have also been recorded which are also made part of the present charge-sheet. The CDRs of the mobile phone numbers of A-6 have also been obtained and made part of the present charge-sheet.

(vii) **A-7 Manisha Sanjay Waghmare** is a private person but on the basis of the prosecution case and the material placed on record, it can be prima facie said that she is one of the prime conspirators of the entire NEET 2026 Exam leak syndicate as the further dissemination of the leaked questions of two subjects (Biology and Chemistry) was from her end. Allegedly, A-7 was associated with A-1 & A-2 and she was working as their agent as she was facilitating candidates to both these accused persons for illegal monetary gain. Allegedly, she had collected the money from the students and their parents for these accused persons. The evidence related to the money trail stated to have been collected during investigation. Allegedly, she was in regular touch with A-1 & A-2 for carrying out the aforesaid illegal activities and in this regard, relevant CDRs have been collected. The statements of the candidates as well as their parents and also the landlords and the owners

of the hotels where students stayed during the relevant period have also been recorded. Allegedly, she was not only working as commission agent for A-1 & A-2 but she was also indulged in selling the question paper of Biology and Chemistry. The dissemination of leaked questions to further part of the country started after A-7 had sold the question papers of these subjects to co-accused (A-8). The devices of A-7 containing digital evidences regarding leaked question papers (mobile handset and laptops) stated to have been seized and relevant digital evidence also stated to have been recovered from these devices. Thus, it is mainly alleged against A-7 that she had arranged candidates for special classes which were organized by A-1 & A-2 and she had collected money for them from the candidates and their parents. She had stored the leaked Biology and Chemistry material on her devices and got the same typed at the Dental Clinic of her husband and thereafter, she sold the leaked questions before the scheduled date of examination to A-8. The statements of several witnesses regarding the active involvement of A-7 in dissemination of the leaked questions through that particular modus operandi have also been recorded which has also been made part of the present charge-sheet. Besides, the CDRs of her mobile phone number for establishing her link with co-accused persons have also been obtained and made part of the present charge-sheet.

(viii) **A-8 Dhananjay Nivrutti Lokhande** is also a private person and allegedly, he was closely associated with A-7 and actively involved in this paper leak. He had procured the leaked paper from A-7. A-7 had a meeting with A-8 at the dental clinic of her husband on 20.04.2026 and 21.04.2026 where these questions were got typed and processed. After getting the same typed, subsequently, on 27.04.2026, the xerox copies of those documents containing the leaked questions were prepared. Certain persons had assisted A-7 and A-8 in this regard and their statements u/s 183 (5) BNSS have been recorded. Allegedly, A-8 had sold the leaked questions further to A-9 for monetary consideration. After the news about the leak surfaced, A-8 destroyed his mobile handset which was containing the data related to leaked questions. After his arrest an amount of Rs.60,000/- was recovered from his car which he obtained by selling the leaked questions. The statements of several witnesses regarding the active involvement of A-8 in dissemination of the leaked questions through that particular modus operandi have also been recorded which have also made part of the present charge-sheet. Besides, the relevant CDRs of his mobile phone have also been obtained to show that A-8 was in regular touch with A-7 and A-9 at the relevant time.

(ix) **A-9 Shubham Madhukar Khairnar** is also a private person and another important link of exam leak syndicate as allegedly, he had procured the leaked questions from A-8

for a promised consideration of Rs.25 Lac. After getting the leaked questions from A-8, he got the same printed and distributed the same to around eight students in the vicinity of Nasik, Maharashtra. Besides, A-9 had also sold the leaked questions to A-10 and the leaked questions were shared by A-9 with A-10 through Telegram App. Allegedly, A-9 had received hefty amount for sharing the leaked questions with several candidates and also for selling the same to A-10. Likewise, A-9 also destroyed his mobile phone after the news about the exam leak broke out. The statements of several witnesses regarding the active involvement of A-9 in dissemination of the leaked questions through that particular modus operandi were recorded during investigation and same have been made part of the present charge-sheet. Besides, the CDRs of his mobile phone number have also been obtained to show his connection with A-8 and A-10.

(x) **A-10 Yash Yadav** is also a private person and allegedly, he is very important link of this entire exam leak syndicate. A-10 was himself a candidate of NEET (UG) Exam 2026. Allegedly, he was also indulged in the illegal activities of selling the leaked question paper. A-10 was the first accused who was arrested (13.05.2026) in this case and thereafter, the details related to the entire exam leak syndicate got revealed through several incriminating evidence collected from him and at his instance. His mobile handset was recovered after his arrest and from his mobile phone several

files which contained the leaked questions were found and recovered. A-10 had saved the mobile phone numbers of A-9 in his mobile phone with the name of “Shubham Maharashtra” and “AP Broker”. The WhatsApp chat that took place between A-10 and A-9 regarding the exchange of leaked questions paper and about collection of educational documents as security from the candidates and their relatives has also been recovered. Allegedly, he had cracked the deal for selling the questions with A-11 (A-11 and A-12 are real brothers and A-13 is the son of A-11). Allegedly, A-11 had offered an amount of Rs.10 Lac to A-10 to buy the leaked question paper. The audio files regarding these specific conversations stated to have also been recovered from the mobile phone of A-11. Since this amount was agreed to be paid after exam, therefore, to secure the said promised amount, A-10 got the original testimonials of the son (who was also a NEET (UG) 2026 aspirant) of A-11 deposited with one of his friends Yash Kakkar which were recovered from his hostel during investigation. The statements of several witnesses regarding the active involvement of A-10 in dissemination of the leaked questions through that particular modus operandi have also been recorded which have been made part of the present charge-sheet. Besides, the CDRs of his mobile phone number have also been obtained to show his link with the aforesaid co-accused persons.

(xi) **A-11 Mangilal Khatik @ Mangilal Biwal, A-12 Dinesh Biwall and A-13 Vikas Biwal** are also private persons and they are close relatives. Allegedly, these accused persons had not only purchased the leaked question paper of NEET (UG) 2026 for their family member (son of A-11) but they also worked as part of the syndicate as they further sold the leaked question paper to several candidates and in this regard also the statements of several candidates have been recorded besides the recovery of relevant WhatsApp chat and telegram chat. As per charge-sheet, the chat recovered from the telegram account of A-11 dated 29.04.2026 shows that he had received the *pdf* files containing the leaked questions alongwith answer keys forwarded by A-10. Allegedly, all these family members (A-11 to A-13) actively participated in selling these leaked questions immediately after receiving the same. The audio files containing the discussions that took place amongst these accused persons stated to have also been recovered to show their active involvement in this exam leak. Allegedly, these accused persons got several sets printed from a shop at Jaipur. For taking the print outs of question paper, A-11 had shared all these *pdfs* received by him from A-10 with the shopkeepers and all the electronic devices where these *pdf* were found stored stated to have been recovered from the said shop. Allegedly, A-12 was actively involved with his brother (A-11) in selling/distribution of the leaked questions after getting the same printed. Likewise, allegedly, A-13 the son

of A-11 was also involved in distributing the leaked questions. He was also actively arranging the candidates for leaked questions. Allegedly, A-13 also distributed the leaked questions through WhatsApp to several candidates. The CDRs/WhatsApp chat to establish that A-11 to A-13 were in constantly touch with several candidates during the relevant period stated to have also been obtained during investigation. The statements of several witnesses regarding the active involvement of A-11 to 13 in dissemination of the leaked questions through the aforesaid particular modus operandi have also been recorded which have also been made part of the present charge-sheet. Besides, the CDRs of mobile phone of all these accused persons have also been obtained to show that A-11 was in regular touch with A-10 and A-11 to A-13 were in regular touch with several candidates at the relevant time.

4. In view of the aforesaid discussions, it is prima facie clear from the overwhelming incriminating material collected by the CBI through an extensive investigation that all the aforementioned accused persons, in one manner or the other, formed part of the NEET (UG) 2026 Exam leak syndicate and each one of them have played an active role in dissemination and circulation of the aforesaid exam question paper of all three subjects. It also prima facie seems from the chargesheet that A-2 P.V Kulkarni was fully aware that there was no practice of frisking of the subject experts at the designated place, therefore, he took advantage of the

situation and took alongwith him the chits/short notes prepared by him discreetly while doing the translation work for his subject. Further, it is clear from the record that all these three experts had given their written undertaking before they were engaged for this work that they will not share any part of the NEET (UG) 2026 Exam related material with anyone in nay manner. All these undertakings have been seized and placed on record (D-18, D-19, D-21, D-22 and D-23). This prima facie shows that these accused persons have committed the criminal breach of trust with the NTA authority which engaged them for the purpose of translation of NEET (UG) 2026 Exam question paper of their respective subjects. Besides, by their aforesaid act, they have also prima facie committed criminal misconduct in terms of Sec. 13 of Prevention of Corruption Act. Furthermore, it is also prima facie clear from the record that all these subject experts (A-1 to A-3), in active conspiracy with other co-accused persons, have in order to obtain the illegal monetary gain, sold the exam related material (the leaked questions of their respective subjects) to the co-accused persons as well as several candidates in the guise of providing coaching to them. All the other co-accused persons have also committed all these offences in active conspiracy with these subject experts. As per charge-sheet, accused persons have also destroyed/disposed of the leaked (NEET (UG) 2026 Exam material and some of them have destroyed their electronic devices also containing the

relevant material. Their aforesaid criminal acts are fully covered within the provisions of Sec. 3, 4, 5 of Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act 2024 which are punishable u/s 10 & 11 of this Act. Thus, it is prima facie clear that all these thirteen accused persons have prima facie committed the aforesaid offences in conspiracy with each other besides committing the substantive offences under the aforesaid Acts. Thus, I hereby take the cognizance of the offences u/s 61(2) r/w 238, 316(5), 317(2), 318(4) of BNS and Section 13(2) r/w 13(1)(a) of PC Act 1988 (as amended in 2018) and Sec.10 r/w Sec. 3,4,5 and Sec.11 of Public Examinations (prevention of Unfair Means) Act 2024 and also of the substantive offences thereof.
